

Dada And Surrealism A Very Short Introduction

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the avant garde movements of dada and surrealism continue to have a huge influence on cultural practice especially in contemporary art with its obsession with sexuality fetishism and shock tactics in this new treatment of the subject hopkins focuses on the many debates surrounding these movements the marquis de sade s surrealist deification issues of quality how good is dali the idea of the readymade attitudes towards the city the impact of freud attitudes to women fetishism and primitivism the international nature of these movements is examined covering the cities of zurich new york berlin cologne barcelona paris london and recently discovered examples in eastern europe hopkins explores the huge range of media employed by both dada and surrealism collage painting found objects performance art photography film whilst at the same time establishing the aesthetic differences between the movements he also examines the dadaist obsession with the body as mechanism in relation to the surrealists return to the fetishized eroticized body about the series the very short introductions series from oxford university press contains hundreds of titles in almost every subject area these pocket sized books are the perfect way to get ahead in a new

bringing together many surrealist texts that have never previously been available in english this collection is an essential guide for anyone who wishes to understand the surrealist movement it traces its development in the words of the surrealists themselves offering a definitive expression of surrealism as a collective movement it shows the extent of surrealist positions and interests and shows how having become a major cultural phenomenon of the twentieth century the issues it has raised remain central to current debates covering the period 1922 91 these texts illuminate its philosophical political and ethical positions and locate surrealism in a broader social and cultural context comprising statements from surrealist groups in paris belgium romania sweden and czechoslovakia and signed by the major participants it reveals the international dimension of surrealism

from betty boop to donald duck tex avery to walt disney collage animation to japanese anime and claymation to 3d animation surrealism and animation is the first book to identify correspondences between the art of animation and the international surrealist movement sharing a deep commitment to a reanimation of everyday life surrealist artists and animators sought a marvellous living form of art cartoons and trick films by pioneers such as georges méliès were influential for salvador dalí and andré breton among others many other surrealists and their associates such as max ernst joseph cornell hans richter len lye roland topor jan Švankmajer and lawrence jordan turned to animated cinema and theories of animacy to express their surrealist visions surrealism and animation is the first book devoted to surrealism's vivid engagement with the history theory and medium of animation on a transnational basis featuring seventeen essays by leading and emerging scholars as well as interviews with contemporary artists penny slinger and jacolby satterwhite this collection investigates a shimmering range of topics on animated surrealism including black humour queer subjectivities ecofeminism black surrealisms and more

in the decades between the two world wars greek writers and artists adopted surrealism both as an avant garde means of overturning the stifling traditions of their classical heritage and also as a way of responding to the extremely unstable political situation in their country despite producing much first rate work throughout the rest of the twentieth century greek surrealists have not been widely read outside of greece this volume seeks to remedy that omission by offering authoritative translations of the major works of the most important greek surrealist writers nikos stabakis groups the greek surrealists into three generations the founders such as andreas embirikos nikos engonopoulos and nicolas calas the second generation and the pali group which formed around the magazine pali for each generation he provides a very helpful introduction to the themes and concerns that animate their work as well as concise biographies of each writer stabakis anthologizes translations of all the key surrealist works of each generation poetry prose letters and other documents as well as a selection of rarer texts his introduction to the volume places greek surrealism within the context of the international movement showing how greek writers and artists used surrealism to express their own cultural and political realities

this collection of essays inspired by andré breton's concept of the limites non frontières of surrealism focuses on the crossings intersections and margins of the surrealist movement rather than its divides and exclusion zones some of the essays originated as papers given at the colloquium surrealism crossings frontiers held at the institute of romance studies university of london in november 2001 surrealism is foregrounded as a trajectory rather than a fixed body of doctrines radically challenging the notion of frontiers the essays explore real and imaginary journeys as well as the urban dérives of the surrealists and situationists the concept of crossing central to a reading of the dynamics at work in surrealism is explored in studies of the surrealist object which eludes or elides genres and explorations of the shifting sites of identity as in the work of joyce mansour or andré masson surrealism's engagement with frontiers is further investigated through a number of revealing cases such as a political reading of 1930s photography the parodic rewriting of the popular locked room mystery or the surrealists cavalier redrawing of the map of the world the essays contribute to our

understanding of the diversity and dynamism of surrealism as an international and interdisciplinary movement

beginning in paris in the 1920s women poets essayists painters and artists in other media have actively collaborated in defining and refining surrealism s basic project achieving a higher open and dynamic consciousness from which no aspect of the real or the imaginary is rejected indeed few artistic or social movements can boast as many women forebears founders and participants perhaps only feminism itself yet outside the movement women s contributions to surrealism have been largely ignored or simply unknown this anthology the first of its kind in any language displays the range and significance of women s contributions to surrealism letting surrealist women speak for themselves penelope rosemont has assembled nearly three hundred texts by ninety six women from twenty eight countries she opens the book with a succinct summary of surrealism s basic aims and principles followed by a discussion of the place of gender in the movement s origins she then organizes the book into historical periods ranging from the 1920s to the present with introductions that describe trends in the movement during each period rosemont also prefaces each surrealist s work with a brief biographical statement

nicholson argues that surrealism has exercised a significant and positive influence over twentieth century latin american literature particularly poetry

a new evaluation of a writer who was the talk of the literary world in the early days of the sexual revolution since the publication of *tropic of cancer* in 1934 henry miller has been the target of critics from all sides a self made surrealist sets out to provide a view of miller different from both earlier vindications of him as sexual liberator and prophet and more contemporary feminist critiques of him as pornographer and male chauvinist in this re evaluation of miller s role as a radical writer blinder considers not only notions of obscenity and sexuality but also the emergence of psychoanalysis surrealism automatic writing and the aesthetics of fascism as they illuminate miller s more general 20th century concerns with politics and mass psychology in relation to art blinder also considers the effect on miller of the theoretical works of georges bataille and andré breton among others in order to define and explore the social philosophical and political contexts of the period by examining the enormous impetus miller got from being in the midst of french culture and its debate a self made surrealist shows that miller was indeed a seminal writer of the period rather than simply an isolated male chauvinist

the author analyses how the surrealists utilised the tactics of documentary and how surrealist ideas in turn influenced the development of documentary photography this is a study of what louis aragon called surrealist realism the exploration of the real life surreality of the city

the art of robert rauschenberg 1925 2008 is usually viewed as quite distinct from surrealism a movement which the artist himself displayed some hostility towards however rauschenberg had a very positive reception among surrealists particularly across the period 1959 69 in the face of rauschenberg s avowals of his own literalism and insistence on his art as facts this book gathers generous evidence of the poetic metaphorical allusive associative and connotative dimensions of the artist s oeuvre as identified by surrealists and thus extrapolates new readings from rauschenberg s key works on that basis by viewing rauschenberg s art against the expansion of the cultural influence of the united states in europe in the period after the second world war and the increasingly politicized activities of the surrealists in the era of the algerian war of independence 1954 62 robert rauschenberg and surrealism shows how poetic inference of the artist s work was turned towards political interpretation by analysing rauschenberg s art in the context of surrealism and drawing from it new interpretations and perspectives this volume simultaneously situates the surrealist movement in 1960s american art criticism and history
