movement disorder emergencies diagnosis and treatment provides a fresh and unique approach to what is already a high profile subspecialty area in clinical neurology the disorders covered in this volume are standard fare in the field but emphasize the urgencies and emergencies that can occur one of the very attractive features of the field of movement disorders is that diagnosis is often based on unique visible and sometimes audible phenomenological symptoms and signs therefore in this era of highly sophisticated laboratory and radiological diagnostic tools the diagnosis of many movement disorders is still largely made in the clinic where pattern recognition is key crucial to astute clinical diagnosis is broad clinical experience in short you have to have seen one to recognize one patients with movement disorders nearly always present as outpatients but as aptly recognized by drs frucht and fahn this may include acute manifestations leading to emergency presentations often in an emergency room setting where they are very likely to be unrecognized and therefore poorly managed the authors define an emergency movement disorder as one in which failure to promptly diagnose and treat may result in significant morbidity or mortality however they also stress the importance of certain can t miss diagnoses such as wilson s disease dopa responsive dystonia and whipple s disease in which delayed diagnosis in less emergent situations can lead to slowly evolving and often irreversible neurological damage with tragic consequences

this innovative resource presents the principles of manual therapy examination and management paired with a cd rom that contains high quality video clips of procedures this multimedia approach explains and demonstrates both the underlying clinical reasoning and the technical execution of key manual therapy procedures the book begins with discussions of the key concepts related pain mechanisms and focuses on procedures and associated reasoning that are appropriate for treating pain states that are predominantly nociceptive a critical distinction not often addressed in other books its focus includes joint neural and muscle soft tissue system examination and management procedures grounded in biomedical reasoning patient self management strategies are provided for long term success successfully integrates principles

the field of movement disorders is relatively broad encompassing disorders of increased movement such as tremors dystonia and tics to disorders characterized by a paucity of movement such as parkinson's disease our understanding of the pathogenic mechanisms and our treatment options are expanding at a rapid pace this expansion ranges from the medical and surgical advances in treating parkinson's disease to the flood of genetic abnormalities that have now been found to cause various movement disorders although many patients are seen by the movement disorders specialist in neurology clinics around the country most of these patients receive their followup care from a primary care physician or general neurologist who must be versed in the characteristics and treatment plans of this diverse group of disorders the major goal of parkinson's disease and movement disorders diagnosis and treatment guidelines for the practicing physician is to distill this immense amount of information and to educate the practitioner about the many facets of the movement disorders field we believe that this book fills a large void since most texts on movement disorders are more detailed and geared toward the specialist we have asked the chapter authors to emphasize the clinical characteristics of each disorder discuss the differential diagnosis and the diagnostic testing and then outline the various treatment options as if they were teaching during a preceptorship in their clinic

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
