Duck For President Duck for President Logline A cynical duck with a heart of gold runs for President challenging the status quo and inspiring hope in a society disillusioned with the political system Act I Exposition Scene 1 to Quackers a jaded but sharpwitted duck who has seen the corrupting influence of politics firsthand We see him working as a janitor in the Capitol building cleaning up after powerhungry politicians Scene 2 Quackers is disillusioned with the current political landscape He witnesses the hypocrisy and corruption firsthand leading to a moment of frustration where he exclaims This is all wrong This isn't what democracy is supposed to be Scene 3 A chance encounter with a group of young idealists who are advocating for a fairer system inspires Quackers He begins to see the possibility of change sparking a flicker of hope within him Scene 4 Quackers gets a push from a quirky optimistic duck named Polly who believes in his ability to change things She inspires him to run for President convincing him that he has something to offer the nation Scene 5 Quackers faces skepticism and ridicule from the established political players His initial attempts to gain attention are met with dismissive laughter and insults highlighting the challenge he faces as an outsider Act II Rising Action Scene 1 Quackers campaign begins to gain traction fueled by his genuine message of hope and his unorthodox approach to politics He connects with people on a human level emphasizing his desire for a fairer society Scene 2 Quackers faces obstacles from the powerful incumbent President a ruthless and cynical politician determined to maintain his grip on power The President throws every dirty tactic he can at Quackers attempting to discredit him and sabotage his campaign Scene 3 Despite the relentless attacks Quackers remains committed to his ideals He faces internal conflict and selfdoubt but Polly and the young idealists remind him of the importance of his mission Scene 4 Quackers campaign gains momentum with the support of the people who are tired of the status quo and yearn for change He delivers a powerful and moving speech that resonates with the nation creating a sense of unity and hope Scene 5 The election day arrives filled with suspense and anticipation The nation watches as the votes are tallied and the outcome hangs in the balance Act III Resolution Scene 1 The results of the election are revealed revealing a tight race Quackers
