Edward Albee The Goat Script

volume i is the first of two volumes that document the three components of the childes project it is divided into two parts which provide an introduction to the use of computational tools for studying language learning the first part is the chat manual which describes the conventions and principles of chat transcription and recommends specific methods for data collection and digitization the second part is the clan manual which describes the uses of the editor sonic chat and the various analytic commands the book will be useful for both novice and experienced users of the childes tools as well as instructors and students working with transcripts of child language volume ii describes in detail all of the corpora included in the childes database the conversational interactions in the corpora come from monolingual children and their caregivers and siblings as well as bilingual children older school aged children adult second language learners children with various types of language disabilities and aphasic recovering from language loss the database includes transcripts in 26 different languages

this volume provides a key analysis of asian children's literature and film and creates a dialogue between east and west and between the cultures from which they emerge within the complex symbiosis of their local national and transnational frameworks in terms of location and content the book embraces a broad scope including contributions related to the asian american diaspora china india indonesia iran japan malaysia the philippines south korea sri lanka and taiwan individually and collectively these essays broach crucial questions what elements of asian literature and film make them distinctive both within their own specific culture and within the broader asian area what aspects link them to these genres in other parts of the world how have they represented and shaped the societies and cultures they inhabit what moral codes do they address underpin or contest the volume provides further voice to the increasingly diverse and fascinating output of the region and emphasises the importance of asian art forms as depictions of specific cultures but also of their connection to broader themes in children's texts and scholarship within this field

gay drama the boys in the band by mart crowley no other major american playwright of this period including thornton wilder arthur miller tennessee williams or william inge produced the plays of their junior colleagues with a specific focus on difference and diversity for most scholars these productions and albee s involvement in them are a somewhat obscure footnote in theatre history but they remain important for their early support of diverse voices even as albee s career was skyrocketing he and his producers had begun a producing project that sowed the seeds of diversity equity and inclusion in a decidedly anti racist decolonizing and progressive move that still resonates powerfully today while this book is not a hagiography and does not intend to paint albee as without his own critical failings in terms of diversity in his own work and that of others this volume of theatre history dramatic literature and performance essays takes a detailed critical approach to albee s engagement with other initiating plays productions producers theatre companies theatre artists and performances in the united states that pushed the dial toward difference and diversity in the late 1950s through the late 1970s beginning the formations of new theatres of identity across the united states this volume will be of great interest to students and scholars in theatre and performance studies
