this book aims at bringing together and providing all the information available on the bible in the early irish church a d 550 850 drawing on some sources not well known for this subject such as columbanus the early writer apponius st gall list of works in irish script and the libri scottice scripti the beginnings are stressed after which the biblical compositions for three following centuries are given the direct links of irish literal psalm interpretation with the fourth century antioch on the orontes school are made clear as is the presence of apocryphal and extra biblical and possibly jewish tradition in the poems of blathmac and other irish compositions see inside the book

this is the first comprehensive study of the contribution that texts from britain and ireland made to the development of canon law in early medieval europe the book concentrates on a group of insular texts of church law chief among them the irish hibernensis tracing their evolution through mutual influence their debt to late antique traditions from around the mediterranean their reception and occasional rejection by clerics in continental europe their fusion with continental texts and their eventual impact on the formation of a european canonical tradition canonical collections penitentials and miscellanies of church law and royal legislation are all shown to have been living texts which were continually reshaped through a process of trial and error that eventually gave rise to a more stable and more coherent body of church laws through a meticulous text critical study roy flechner argues that the growth of church law in europe owes as much to a serendipitous conversation between texts as it does to any deliberate plan overseen by bishops and popes

many theological interpreters of scripture have claimed that church practices produce well formed readers but which practices greg mckinzie

argues that missional hermeneutics challenges the church to include participation in god s mission among the indispensable components of readerly formation after a quarter century of contemporary reflection on missional theology however the meaning of participation in god s mission remains vague in order to explain why it is a critical hermeneutical experience therefore mckinzie sets out to develop a theological account of missional participation that incorporates the concepts of theōsis embodied narrativity and solidarity then in conversation with the hermeneutical phenomenology of paul ricoeur the study suggests how theologically recontextualizing a model of the movement from embodied commitments to textual interpretation in terms of participation in god s mission illuminates the epistemic reconstitution of the church s theological interpretation of scripture understanding participation in god s mission as theological interpretation s proper locus theologicus should reorient the notion of readerly formation because the formation of missional readers is the process in which god opens the reading community s embodied eyes of faith through the works of faith seeking understanding
