this volume explores italian science fiction from the nineteenth century to the twenty first covering literary texts films music and visual works by figures as diverse as maria rosa cutrufelli peter kolosimo primo levi antonio margheriti gilda musa and roberto vacca it broadens the horizons of both italian studies and the environmental humanities by addressing a long neglected genre and expands our

understanding of relations between the ecological the imaginary and the sociopolitical the chapters draw on a variety of methodological frameworks including animal studies ecocriticism ecofeminism eco media studies energy humanities and posthumanism the reader will gain insights into consequential topics such as anthropocentrism speciesism ecomodernist thought environmental justice struggles at the planetary and regional level non human and new materialist ontologies utopian dystopian philosophies and prospects for transitioning beyond the crisis of petro modernity through the construction of post depletion futures open access versions of the introduction and six of the book chapters are available on the liverpool university press website

willingham presents a historical survey of science fiction drama and focusses particularly on the history of attempts to stage science fiction little attention has been given to science fiction drama though numerous science fiction plays exist this volume gives special attention to works intended for adult audiences with emphasis on the nature of science fiction drama its origins and history the staging of science fiction plays and works by representative playwrights the appendix offers an annotated list of 328 science fiction plays with entries grouped in five categories original drama adaptations musicals and operas theatre pieces and multi media works and frankenstein dramas an extensive bibliography concludes the volume

science fiction is a literary genre based on scientific speculation works of science fiction use the ideas and the vocabulary of all sciences to create valid narratives that explore the future effects of science on events and human beings science fact and science fiction examines in one volume how science has propelled science fiction and to a lesser extent how science fiction has influenced the sciences although coverage will discuss the science behind the fiction from the classical age to the present focus is naturally on the 19th century to the present when the industrial revolution and spectacular progress in science and technology triggered an influx of science fiction works speculating on the future as scientific developments alter expectations for the future the literature absorbs uses and adapts such contextual visions the goal of the encyclopedia is not to present a catalog of sciences and their application in literary fiction but rather to study the ongoing flow and counterflow of influences including how fictional representations of science affect how we view its practice and disciplines although the main focus is on literature other forms of science fiction including film and video games are explored and because science is an international matter works from non english speaking countries are discussed as needed

science fiction represents a diverse community of writers and readers that spans the entire world this collection provides a global tour of the genre with essays about latin american european african arabic indian japanese and chinese science fiction providing insights about how writers around the world have explored and reinvigorated the genre essays by prominent critics from five continents inform about particular cultures and analyze representative texts by authors such as tobias s buckell

lourengo mutarelli stanislaw lem masande ntshanga tawfiq al hakim anil menon and cixin liu the contributing scholars examine how national experiences have shaped these narratives which often differ strikingly from anglo american science fiction an introductory survey of foreign language science fiction in the united states endeavors to explain why so many of these texts have remained unknown to anglophone readers an extensive bibliography lists numerous resources for further study of science fiction from various parts of the world

in this highly original book russell blackford discusses the intersection of science fiction and humanity s moral imagination with the rise of science and technology in the 19th century and our continually improving understanding of the cosmos writers and thinkers soon began to imagine futures greatly different from the present science fiction was born out of the realization that future technoscientific advances could dramatically change the world along with the developments described in modern science fiction space societies conscious machines and upgraded human bodies to name but a few come a new set of ethical challenges and new forms of ethics blackford identifies these issues and their reflection in science fiction his fascinating book will appeal to anyone with an interest in philosophy or science fiction or in how they interact this is a seasoned balanced analysis of a major issue in our thinking about the future seen through the lens of science fiction a central art of our time everyone from humanists to technologists should study these ideas and examples blackford s book is wise and savvy and a delight to read as well greg benford author of timescape

while students and general readers typically cannot relate to esoteric definitions of science fiction they readily understand the genre as a literature that characteristically deals with subjects such as new inventions space robot and aliens this book looks at science fiction in precisely this manner with twenty one chapters that each deal with a subject that is repeatedly addressed in science fiction of recent centuries based on a packet of original essays that the author assembled for his classes the book could serve as a supplemental textbook in science fiction classes but also contains material of interest to science fiction scholars and others devoted to the genre in some cases chapters offer thorough surveys of numerous works involving certain subjects such as imagined vehicles journeys beneath the earth and undersea adventures discovering intriguing patterns in the ways that various writers developed their ideas when comprehensive coverage of ubiquitous topics such as robots aliens and the planet mars is impossible chapters focus on major themes referencing selected texts a conclusion discusses other science fiction subjects that were omitted for various reasons and a bibliography lists additional resources for the study of science fiction in general and the topics of each chapter

since its emergence in the seventeenth century science fiction has been a sustained coherent and subversive check on the promises and pitfalls of science in their turn invention and discovery have

forced fiction writers to confront the nature and limits of reality different engines traces the way in which we've imagined the future

in the new millennium what secrets lay beyond the far reaches of the universe what mysteries belie the truths we once held to be self-evident the world of science fiction has long been a porthole into the realities of tomorrow blurring the line between life and art now in the year's best science fiction twenty-eighth annual collection the very best sf authors explore ideas of a new world this venerable collection of short stories brings together award-winning authors and masters of the field such as Robert Reed Alastair Reynolds Damien Broderick Carrie Vaughn Ian R.
