questions and lowest on extended response questions 2 the advantage of female students over male students in reading achievement was more evident for the short constructed response questions than for multiple choice questions and the most evident for extended response questions and 3 when demonstrating comprehension of texts that they had selected from a compendium of seven short stories eighth and twelfth graders demonstrated relative success in answering the constructed response questions also included in the report are results of students performance in reading for different purposes finally two special studies conducted in 1992 are highlighted in the report a literary selection task and a comparison of oral and written responses to comprehension questions contains 31 tables and five figures of data a procedural appendix is attached rs
