founded by allen lane in 1935 penguin books soon became the most read publisher in the united kingdom and was synonymous with the british paperback making high quality reading cheaply available to millions penguin helped democratise reading in so doing penguin played an important part in the cultural and intellectual life of the english speaking world for this book which has its origins in the successful international conference held at bristol university in 2010 to mark 75 years of penguin books recognised scholars from different fields examine various aspects of penguin s significance and achievement david cannadine and simon eliot offer wide historical perspectives of penguin s place and impact other scholars including alistair mccleery kimberley reynolds andrew sanders claire squires susie harries andrew nash tom boll and william john lyons examine more particularised subjects these range from the breaking of the lady chatterley ban to the visions of the future contained in puffin books from penguin classics to the scholarly and commercial interests in publishers anniversaries from the art and architectural histories of nikolaus pevsner to the art and design of penguin covers and from the translation of poetry to the transcription of the dead sea scrolls together the essays depict much of what it was that made penguin the most important british publishing house of the twentieth century

emphasizing the vast changes in literary criticism that have occurred during the last thirty years h m daleski reexamines thomas hardy s novels in the novelist s own terms presenting a revisionary account of his treatment of gender he also shows that hardy was not as sexist as is asserted in much feminist criticism and that his female characters are sympathetically portrayed as the centers of his fictional worlds by carefully analyzing the novels daleski refutes the generally accepted reason for hardy s abandonment of fiction at the height of his powers claiming that he drove himself to a dead end in jude the obscure the typical hardy plot places a female protagonist in a love triangle with two male protagonists who are portrayed as polar opposites the woman contradicting a general view of her as victim is always granted the freedom of choice of a marriage partner she invariably makes the wrong choice which leads to a bad marriage and disastrous sexual relationships as this scenario is played out in most of hardy s novels the men are presented as distinct types the types being depicted with rich diversity and with steadily greater psychological depth hardy s rendering of sexuality in both his male and his female characters is marked by its originality and profundity in his intuitions about sexual relations daleski maintains hardy was not outdone by writers such as lawrence and joyce daleski studies hardy within his victorian context but he also shows that hardy both in his depiction of sexuality and in his technical innovations was in advance of his time in these respects hardy deserves to be regarded as a forerunner of the great modernists in thomas hardy and paradoxes of love daleski offers acute and thoughtful analyses of hardy s major novels avoiding critical jargon the author has made his book accessible to all readers with an interest in hardy and his novels as well as in the study of gender in english literature

first published in 1969 george eliot is a writer of ordinary human experience whose work emphasizes commonplace characters and commonplace situations her mind however was far from ordinary professor adam shows how wit observation and sympathy combined with a lucid and energetic intelligence enabled her to invest the commonplace with complexity and importance extracts from george eliot s major novels illustrate her treatment of character setting dialogue and narrative while the author s commentary discusses the particulars of her artistic procedures and techniques this title will be of interest to students of literature

female voice dealing with minor writers as well as better known figures it opens up new areas of critical investigation claiming not only that many nineteenth century female novelists have been undeservedly neglected but also that the major ones are further illuminated by being considered alongside their less familiar contemporaries
