leo strauss s lifelong intellectual mission was to recover classical rationalism a pursuit that has made him a controversial figure to this day while his critics see him as responsible for a troubling anti democratic strain in modern

politics others argue that his thought is in fact the best defence of responsible democracy neil robertson s new introduction to strauss aims to transcend these divides and present a non partisan account of his thought he shows how strauss intellectual formation in weimar germany and flight from nazism led him to develop a critique of modernity that tended to support a conservative politics while embracing a radical sense of what philosophy is and can be he examines the way in which strauss built upon the thought of nietzsche and heidegger in order to show how their nihilism led not to a standpoint beyond western rationality but to a recovery of its roots this skillful reconstruction of the coherence and unity of strauss thought is the essential guide for anyone wishing to fully grasp the contribution of one of the most contentious and intriguing figures in 20th century intellectual history

in the legacy of st george tucker chad vanderford provides a cogent longitudinal explication of how virginia intellectuals constructed and defined proslavery ideology and state rights he reminds twenty first century readers that in order to judge late eighteenth and early nineteenth century thinkers fairly they must position basic political ideas within the context of their day not ours vanderford s book will prove valuable not only for students and researchers of political theory but also of southern intellectual life and the political worlds of the colonial early national and old south john david smith charles h stone distinguished professor of american history university of north carolina at charlotte historians born during and after the civil rights movement have struggled to take the proslavery and pro secession arguments of the eighteenth and nineteenth century south seriously they generally tend to lump the two theories together as components of one ideology and then attempt to write it out of the political norms of american life in this groundbreaking study vanderford isolates the different ideological strands in southern political thought of this era and works to understand these ideas in the context of their time st george tucker 1752 1827 founding father professor and political theorist saw clearly that slavery runs against the grain of the values articulated in the declaration of independence under certain narrowly construed circumstances however he thought it necessary to tolerate slavery he viewed secession as an extreme step but one that the declaration of independence left open as a possibility for all free states st george tucker s arguments hinged on a modern view of natural right that builds on the premise that political power can only be legitimate if it rests on the consent of the governed he believed that equally free and independent individuals constructed a voluntary union of equally free and independent states his son henry tucker 1780 1848 and grandson john randolph tucker 1823 1897 sought to defend this ideology of modern natural right

against fellow professors north and south who tended to replace it with the ancient ideology of natural right the view that wisdom gives one the title to command many southern intellectuals came to believe that individuals are not equally free and independent by nature many northerners came to argue that the states had never been equally free and independent these disagreements contributed to the outbreak of the civil war at once a work of intellectual history that shows the key role played by professors in helping to formulate southern ideology as well as a recovery of rarely explored arguments this work wrestles with one of the greatest challenges of intellectual history the effort to understand the most controversial ideas of the past on their own terms while searching for the genealogy that connects the past to the present chad vanderford is an associate professor of history at the university of texas of the permian basin his articles and reviews have appeared in publications including civil war history the journal of southern history and the virginia magazine of history and biography

in this volume prominent political theorist michael zuckert presents an important and pathbreaking set of meditations on the thought of john locke in more than a dozen provocative essays many appearing in print for the first time zuckert explores the complexity of locke s engagement with his philosophical and theological predecessors his profound influence on later liberal thinkers and his amazing success in transforming the political understanding of the anglo american world at the same time he also demonstrates locke s continuing relevance in current debates involving such prominent thinkers as rawls and macintyre zuckert s careful reconsideration of locke s role as launcher of liberalism involves a sustained engagement with the hermeneutical issues surrounding locke an innovator who faced special rhetorical needs in addressing his contemporaries and the future it also involves highlighting the novelty of locke s position by examining his stance toward the philosophical and religious traditions in place when he wrote zuckert argues that neither of the dominant ways of understanding locke s relations to his predecessors and contemporaries is adequate he is not well seen as a follower of any orthodoxy nor of any anti orthodoxy of his day either philosophical or theological he found a path to innovation that was philosophically radical but which was also able to connect with prevailing and accepted traditions that allowed him to exercise a practical influence in history rarely if ever matched by any other philosopher zuckert illustrates that influence by showing how william blackstone used lockean philosophy to reshape the common law and how the americans of the eighteenth century used lockean philosophy to reshape whig political thought zuckert argues that locke s philosophy has continuing philosophic and political force a proposition he demonstrates by arguing that locke presents a form of political philosophy superior to that of the liberal theorists of our day and that he has solid rejoinders to contemporary critics of liberalism

the classical steven shankman argues should not be confused with a particular historical period of western antiquity although it may owe its original articulation to the literary and philosophical explorations of ancient greek authors shankman s book searches for and attempts to formulate the shape of the continuing presence as embodied in

particular literary works mainly from western antiquity and the neoclassical and modern periods of what the author calls a classical understanding of literature for shankman literature defined from a classical perspective is a coherent compelling and rationally defensible representation that resists being reduced either to the mere recording of material reality or to the bare exemplification of an abstract philosophical precept he derives his definition largely from his reading of greek literature from homer through plato from the history of literary criticism and from the greco roman tradition in english american and french literature shankman reveals unsuspected yet convincing connections among authors of such widely disparate times and places his idea of the classic that authorizes these connections is presented as normative thus making possible the evaluation of literary works and in turn forthright discussion of what constitutes the literary as distinct from other kinds of discourse shankman s study runs counter to a strong tendency of contemporary criticism that argues precisely against any distinct category of the literary he offers a series of interpretations that cumulatively advance theoretical discussion by challenging scholars to rethink the critical paradigms of postmodernism at the center of the book is a discussion of the quintessentially classic valéry poem le cimetière marin and the classic qualities it shares with pindar s third pythian ode from which valéry derives the epigraph for his poem
