andrew was recruited into the british secret intelligence service in 1939 for his linguistic talents and other qualities while working in the banking sector in the city of london from the beginning of wwii he worked full time for the service his first mission was to witness the attempted assassination of hitler in munich in november 1939 followed by three further missions sabotaging a german train carrying armaments deep inside
