g del defends a modern version of plato s argument for the immortality of the soul the self is essentially conscious and hence essentially living it is therefore deathless and cannot receive death but then it also cannot become something else nor can it be destroyed since that would be receiving death also so the self or immortal and immaterial the book then considers materialist theories of the mind and rejects them it formulates an argument from introspection which the author believes establishes substance dualism the argument for immortality and the ontological argument for the existence of god are parallel in that attempt to establish the existence of necessary beings since immortality makes sense within a theistic context the second half of the book defends a version of g del s ontological argument for god s existence utilizing experience of the moral good and that mutual entailment of the attributes of god to argue that these attributes including necessary existence are logically coherent in the final chapter the author uses the central arguments in the book to support accounts of the afterlife from those who have had near death experiences

adam rosenthal's *prosthetic immortalities* shows how the dream of indefinite life has always been a technological one a matter of prosthesis he argues that every biological instance of perpetual life from one celled organisms to rejuvenating jellyfish to henrietta lacks's immortal cancer cells always results in the transformation of the original being there can therefore be no certainty of immortality yet because finite mortal life is already marked by difference division and change as rosenthal concludes the problem of immortality will not cease to haunt us *prosthetic immortalities* examines the persistence of humans aspirations of deathlessness showing that the link between immortalization and prostheticization is not unique to a single period but is rather a ubiquitous element of the discourse of immortality encompassing both modern technoscientific efforts and religious discourses of an afterlife rosenthal asks to what extent the emergence of a virtual posited immortal presence follows from the tenets of empirical science and not simply from the discourse of biology but also and more radically still from biological organization itself rosenthal ultimately argues that the discovery of biological immortals lifeforms that naturally have indefinitely long lifespans such as cancer cells and bacteria present novel conceptual difficulties for traditional philosophical approaches to mortality and selfhood asking whether it is life itself that first births immortalizing prostheses

this is volume iii of eight in a collection on the philosophy of the mind and language originally published in 1925 this text looks at alternative theories of life and mind at the level of enlightened common sense the mind's knowledge of existents and the unconscious

elias john wilkinson gibb 1857 1901 was a scottish orientalist who was born and educated in glasgow after studying arabic and persian he developed an interest in turkish language and literature especially poetry and in 1882 he published ottoman poems translated into english verse in the original forms this was a forerunner to the six volume classic presented here a history of ottoman poetry published in london between 1900 and 1909 gibb died in london of scarlet fever at the age of 44 and only the first volume of his masterpiece appeared before his death his family entrusted to his friend edward granville browne 1862 1926 a distinguished orientalist in his own right who had made a special

study of babism the task of posthumously publishing the five remaining volumes browne characterized the work as one of the most important if not the most important critical studies of any muhammadan literature produced in europe during the last half century the first volume contains a long and compelling introduction by gibb on the entire subject in which he argues that ottoman poetry often rose and fell in tandem with ottoman power gibb divides ottoman poetry into two great schools the old or asiatic circa 1300 1859 which generally was characterized by its deference to persian influences and the new or european from 1859 onward which was influenced by french and other western poetry according to gibb the old or asiatic school went through a four periods a formative period 1300 1450 a period 1450 1600 in which works were modeled after the persian poet jami a period 1600 1700 dominated by the influences of persian poets urfi shirazi and sa ib tabrizi and a period of uncertainty that lasted until 1859 the european school that followed was inaugurated by ibrahim sinasi 1826 71 who in 1859 produced a small but momentous collection of french poetry translated into turkish verse the influence of the collection was far reaching and eventually changed the course of ottoman poetry gibb is known for his masterful translations that brilliantly render into english both the meaning and the form of ottoman persian and arabic poetry for almost a century after his death a family trust financed the gibb memorial series of editions and translations into english of arabic persian and turkish texts
