in the labors of modernism mary wilson analyzes the unrecognized role of domestic servants in the experimental forms and narratives of modernist fiction by virginia woolf gertrude stein nella larsen and jean rhys examining issues of class gender and race in a transatlantic modernist context wilson brings attention to the place where servants enter literature the threshold in tracking their movements across the architectural borders separating indoors and outdoors and across the physical doorways between rooms wilson illuminates the ways in which the servants who open doors symbolize larger social limits and exclusions as well as states of consciousness the relationship between female servants and their female employers is of particular importance in the work of female authors for whom the home and the novel are especially interconnected sites of authorization and domestication modernist fiction wilson shows uses domestic service to tame and interrogate not only issues of class but also the overlapping distinctions of racial and ethnic identities as woolf stein larsen and rhys use the novel to interrogate the limitations of gendered domestic ideologies they find they must deploy these same ideologies to manage the servant characters whose labor maintains the domestic spaces they find limiting thus the position of servants in these texts forces the reader to recognize servants not just as characters but as conditions for

the production of literature and of the homes in which literature is created

draws on unpublished historical archives to investigate the writing and thinking processes behind Woolf's interwar cultural criticism

argument and imagination are often interdependent the aesthetics of argument is concerned with how this relationship may bear on argument's concern with truth not just persuasion and with the enhancement of understanding such interdependence may bring the rationality of argument conceived as the advancement of reasons for or against a claim is not simply a matter of deductive validity whether arguments are relevant have force or look foolish or whether an example is telling or merely illustrative cannot always be assessed in these terms Martin Warner presents a series of case studies which explore how analogy metaphor narrative image and symbol can be used in different ways to frame one domain in terms of another severally or in various combinations and how criteria drawn from the study of imaginative literature may have a bearing on their truth aptness such framing can be particularly effective in argumentative roles which invite self-interrogation as Plato saw long ago narrative in such cases may be fictional whether parabolic or dramatic autobiographical or biographical and in certain cases may seek to show how standard conceptualizations are inadequate beyond this whether in poetry or prose and not only with respect to narrative the logic of imagery enables us to make principled sense of our capacity to grasp imaginistically elements of our experience through words whose use at the imaginative level has transformed their standard conceptual relationships and hence judge the credibility of associated arguments assessment of the argumentative imagination requires criteria drawn not only from dialectic and rhetoric but also from poetics

philanthropy and early twentieth century British literature explores the relationship between British literature and philanthropy at the end of the nineteenth and early twentieth centuries examining the works of E. M. Forster Rebecca West W. B. Yeats Roger Fry Wyndham Lewis Virginia Woolf and Vita Sackville-West this book considers how writers in the modernist period drew on the liberal welfare reforms the adoption of scientific methods in charity the Cambridge tradition of public service the Irish nationalist movement and the influence of the Victorian woman philanthropist in order to advocate for an individualist art revolutionize their aesthetics redefine ideals of hospitality and beneficence and affirm the national social and economic liberation of the modern subject contrary to popular interpretations presenting modernism as a break with Victorian values Dr. Radeva Costello argues philanthropic engagements are at the heart of early twentieth century literature the writers discussed in this book had a sophisticated knowledge of the philanthropy debates and of their power to transform twentieth century notions about how to govern how to conceive of national class and gender boundaries and how to market the work of the professional artist in the real world in keeping with the strong archival and historicizing

approach of the new modernist studies of recent years this book also analyses the rich contextual detail of early modernist magazines contemporary and archival periodicals and government publications
