the third part of the book synthesizes social science research on specific causes and correlates of obesity such as food advertising food prices and peers the fourth section summarizes social science research on the consequences of obesity such as lower wages job absenteeism and discrimination the fifth and final section reviews the social science literature on obesity treatment and prevention such as food taxes school based interventions and medical treatments such as anti obesity drugs and bariatric surgery
