from federal rebates for high efficiency appliances to bottle deposits to meatless Mondays practices promoting sustainability are now incorporated into our daily lives due to the establishment of protection agencies and the efforts of activist groups the wider public has become more conscious of the impact we humans make on the planet and what we can do to preserve what we have religious communities long concerned with broad issues of social responsibility and justice have naturally become full participants in this greening movement in green discipleship catholic theological ethics scholars from the fields of theology and the social and hard sciences discuss this development and consider how a proactive approach to the earth's welfare is essentially a moral obligation of Christians and those of other faiths around the world accessible for undergraduate or seminary students this anchor text shows students how saving the earth is ethics in praxis views theology ethics and the environment through a variety of lenses includes tools such as end of chapter questions glossary and sidebars current and relevant green discipleship will prompt students to think more widely about the earth its stewardship and how individual action is a fulfillment of duty

womanist thought and semiotics the book opens with a brief introduction and then moves to an interview with copeland which connects her theology to her life stories the conversation with copeland also provides a backdrop to the seventeen essays that follow extending copeland s theological worldview the contributions are divided according to the following sections embodiment discipleship and politics the essays in the section entitled engaging embodiment critically reflect on the importance of embodiment in christian theology and contemporary culture following copeland s lead authors in this section theorize and theologize the body particularly but not limited to black women s bodies as a locus theologicus that reveals mediates and shapes the splendor and suffering reality of human existence the next section entitled engaging discipleship focuses on the concrete challenges of following jesus in today s world the essays included in this section reflect on copeland s focus on jesus particularity in terms of his solidarity with and for others discipleship is about modeling and mentoring so scholars in this section also comment on copeland s contribution to teaching and pedagogy the last section entitled engaging the political interrogates the political implications of the theological it is noteworthy that there are two trajectories of the political here one is copeland s development of political theology through the lens of canadian jesuit theologian bernard lonergan the other trajectory focuses on the work of theology in contemporary art and politics these three sections are fluid and overlap with one another several of the articles on embodiment speak to questions of solidarity and a few of the essays on discipleship clearly present as political the ways in which each of the contributions in this volume overlap with each other attests to the complex nature of doing constructive theology today and even more how copeland s work is at the forefront of that multi layered polyvalent intersectional theological work

the bible teems with nonhuman life from its opening pages with god s creation of animals on the same day and out of the same earth as humans to its closing apocalyptic scenes of horses riding out of the sky animals are adam s companions noah s shipmates and elijah s saviors they are at the center of ancient israel s religious life as sacrifices and yet as job discovers beyond human dominion it is an animal that saves balaam from certain death by an angel s hand and an animal that carries jesus into jerusalem the creator declares all of them good at the beginning and since the apostle paul writes of god s eternal purposes for all things on earth they are somehow part of a hoped for eschatological restoration so why are animals so

often ignored in christian moral discourse in its theological thinking and faith motivated praxis human centeredness typically results in the complete erasure of the nonhuman this book argues that this exclusion of animals is problematic for those who see the bible as authoritative for the religious life instead biblical literature bears witness to a more inclusive understanding of moral duty and faith motivated largesse that extends also to eden s other residents

vatican ii s famous declaration that the church on earth is by its very nature missionary has often been taken out of context and used to support all manner of church initiatives but the conclusion of the statement since it has its origin in the mission of the son and the holy spirit is of monumental importance in the way of discipleship theologian anthony gittins describes the eternal mission of the trinity historically brought down to earth in the ministry of jesus and then continued to the ends of the earth by those called and sent as disciples throughout future generations gittins explains that christian discipleship must be the living out of jesus own example in many different times and places he encourages people of all ages to follow the invitation of jesus to be missionary disciples the way of discipleship explores several new testament examples of jesus call and commissioning distills the principles involved and then recontextualizes the stories so that they pose a direct challenge to disciples today in this way gittins builds up a picture both of the way of jesus himself and of the way in which today s disciples can loyally follow his call to mission

in sixteen short but perceptive commentaries anthony j gittins recounts the experiences of various women and men from the new testament insiders and outsiders people of substance and people regarded as sinners whose lives were changed by an encounter with jesus based on solid biblical scholarship but retold in language accessible to all and illuminated by the author s fresh perspective these stories emphasize the way in which people come to faith and discover discipleship encountering jesus presents new testament figures in a new light and is perfect for both group study and personal reflection among the discipleship stories included are the healing of the paralytic from the gospel of mark the healing of the canaanite woman s daughter from matthew the conversion of zacchaeus the tax collector from luke and the healing of the man born blind from john anthony j gittins writes typically the stories demonstrate that there are often a number of stages or steps involved the easiest way to identify them is to notice exactly what each person says and in what sequence during his or her encounter with jesus with the rare exception of someone immediately identifying jesus with

god most people are a little slower readers may look out for a three step or four step approach to faith as a person moves to an even more specific identification of jesus it is an interesting enlightening and sometimes surprising exercise

this work is an investigation of the ongoing methodical reconstruction of catholic moral theology as such it is based on and honors the work of norbert rigali s j one of the most important contributors to this reconstruction the decisive break from the traditional manual approach to moral theology represented by vatican ii reoriented moral theology away from universal natural law morality based on the commandments to a morality based on specifically christian sources this reorientation however was not an either or but a both and proposition father norbert rigali s j has been an inspiration and a challenge to moral theologians working toward reconstruction the essays in this collection address four questions in the renewal movement an investigation of normative methods a clarification of sources an investigation of the tension between natural law morality and christian ethics and or morality and a combination of methodical insights of philosophy with traditional christian sources in their investigation of biomedical ethical issues the contributors to the collection include richard m gula s s joseph a selling bernard hoose mark o keefe o s b james f keenan s j edward collins vacek s j charles e curran james j walter todd a salzman jean porter lisa sowle cahill and richard a mccormick s j
