

Guidelines For Barefoot Language Learning

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an in situ or on location approach to language learning is presented for people going abroad for an extended period of time the approach features two components 1 the use of a mentor native speaker who lives in the community and serves as a guide and 2 the daily learning cycle of planning practicing communicating face to face and evaluating this approach gives the traveler responsibility for learning in real interaction situations with immediate feedback examples of topics covered include benchmarks for evaluation selection communication with and compensation for a mentor hints for increasing interaction opportunities language structures nuance and

world missions needs a fully biblical ethos this is the contention of the editors of and contributors to world mission a series of essays aimed at reforming popular approaches to missions in the first set of essays contributors develop a biblical theology of world missions from both the old and new testaments arguing that the theology of each must stand in the foreground of missions not recede into the background in the second they unfold the great commission in sequence detailing how it determines the biblical strategy of all mission enterprises finally they treat current issues in world missions from the perspective of the sufficiency of scripture altogether this book aims to reform missions to be thoroughly□ not just foundationally□ biblical a needed correction even among the sincerest missionaries

this new volume in the award winning encountering mission series is for current and future missionaries it provides practical guidance regarding getting ready for the mission field and the realities of life on the field the authors are well qualified to write such a manual each having served as a missionary for more than twenty years and each having taught missions in seminary the authors begin by examining the contemporary context for missions including the recognition that the world s mission fields are in constant and often rapid change they then discuss aspects of preparing oneself for the mission field beginning with home front preparations and moving to on the field preparations the final section deals with practical issues and challenges of missionary life

paralyzed in a diving accident at the age of 18 tom brewster nevertheless became one of the world s foremost missionary strategists along with his wife and son tom traveled to some of the most remote parts of the world challenging missionaries with strategies of involvement relevance and servanthood

career defining crises in mission is written to help missionaries evaluate their ministry approaches and to pursue those that place relationships over programs each of the 12 chapters takes a well known missiological principle and instead of focusing on the theory behind it uses bible studies illustrations true stories and practical suggestions to encourage missionaries to make decisions that cultivate relationships with people as they choose mission methods

missiology and the social sciences contributions cautions and conclusions missiology draws from several sources these include god s revelation in holy scripture historical creeds and theology past and present missionary experiences and various social sciences that help us to understand diverse cultural and religious dynamics but how exactly do these sources relate to one another how do we balance and prioritize the contributions of each missiology and the social sciences answer these questions with scholarly care on the one hand it s unthinkable that missionaries would not use the social sciences such as anthropology and linguistics how else would

we translate the bible and learn about other cultures on the other hand some writers warn of the subtle danger that social sciences could undermine biblical authority cultural bias also might affect social science research and hinder our ability to discern what god is doing around us the contributors in this book help readers understand the debate and its many practical implications it equips missionaries to engage the social sciences in more thoughtful ways that can bear gospel fruit
