children s display of unacceptable behavior in the school setting school violence academic underachievement and school failure represent a cluster of problems that touches all aspects of society children with learning and behavior problems are much more likely to be un ployed exhibit significant emotional and behavior disorders in adulthood as well as become incarcerated for example by adolescence children with attention deficit hyperactivity d order are more likely to be retained a grade drop out of school have contact with the law or fair worse along a number of dimensions than their unaffected siblings barkely 1998 identification assessment and treatment of children with externalizing behavior problems and learningdisabilities is critical to optimizing development and prevention of relatively tractable behavioral and emotional problems in adulthood for example poor interpersonal problem solving and social skills excesses and deficits are strongly associated with poor o come in adolescence and adulthood the school is where children learn essential academic social and impulse control skills that allow them to function effectively in later years school is where problems in these areas can be most easily identified and addressed the purpose of this book is to provide an overview of assessment practices for evaluating children s externalizing behavior problems exhibited in the school environment reviews of approximately 100 assessment devices for measuring children s externalizing problems are included instruments include structured interviews rating scales and observational methods

this book provides some common background in child development and assists the provider of child assessment services to determine appropriate procedures to answer questions and investigate specific problems it is intended for graduate students in child clinical psychology and school psychology

demonstrates how the fields of special education and inclusive education have evolved philosophically and technically over the past 30 years

this book provides school psychologists counselors social workers school administrators and teachers with a summary of ecologically sound primary secondary and tertiary prevention strategies the contributors cover fundamentals such as how to conduct a behavioral assessment how to measure treatment integrity and response to intervention and how to promote generalization and maintenance of learned positive behaviors they also discuss prevention measures such as positive behavior support and group contingencies that schools can implement system wide several chapters describe more narrowly focused interventions such as daily report cards and self modeling while the final section explains how to customize behavioral strategies for special populations such as preschoolers children with autism internalizing or externalizing disorders and those who have experienced trauma

intended to be a resource for individuals who are working directly with children and adolescents in diverse applied and clinical settings the first section contains perspectives on the field the second section contains an overview of assessment issues in child and adolescent psychotherapy the third section offers a state of the art overview of major therapeutic approaches that represent current practice in child and adolescent psychotherapy the last section includes chapters that are related to major assessment and therapeutic practices a longwood professional book
