aims primarily to identify the factors that influence the graduate experience for audiologists in new zealand from the perspective of both the graduates themselves and supervisors secondly to investigate the factors that contribute positively and negatively to how prepared graduates feel entering the first year of clinical work and finally to better understand the factors that influence graduate s decision about where to begin their clinical audiology career methods two phases were utilised the first of which consisted of semi structured interviews with both graduates and supervisors during which their experiences and opinions related to the graduate process were explored based on the findings from these interviews as well as the findings of previous literature two questionnaires were developed one that was distributed among recent graduates and another for those who have recently held the role of a supervisor results results were consistent across phases graduates personal attributes and the supervisory relationship have the greatest influence on the graduate experience while graduates are confident when entering the workforce they are perceived both by themselves and their supervisors to be ill prepared in the areas of hearing aids and counselling graduates consider numerous factors when deciding where to begin their career but place the most importance on the supervision offered the opportunities for professional development and the culture of the existing team conclusions although numerous factors shape the graduate experience both graduates and supervisors agree that the supervisory relationship and the personal attributes of the graduate themselves have the greatest influence audiologists begin their careers feeling confident largely attributable to their previous experiences and personal attributes yet this confidence doesn t translate to them feeling equipped for every aspect of clinical audiology practice in both supervisors and their own opinions graduates leave university ill prepared for hearing aid fittings repairs and counselling while this thesis confirmed that the experience of audiology graduates in new zealand is generally a positive one it also highlighted opportunities for improvement
