bestiary of corona animals is an essay that illuminates the causal relations between the human tendency to objectify the world the continuous expansion of extractive activity the trace effects of the current climate regime and the outbreak of the current coronavirus pandemic these seemingly distinct phenomena often analyzed and discussed separately in fact share the same roots the text introduces a cast of different animals both fictional and tangibly real whose personal opinions and experiences informed by animal rights and ethics biopower geopolitics and necropolitics give credence to the hypothesis that the human colonization of the natural territory of the virus enabled the pandemic to spread in the first place these animal voices seek for a type of worlding that provides an equal footing for humans and non humans starting by exchanging self interest for empathic non understanding and selfless reciprocity from the isolation of thinking and acting in a vacuum to a world continuum

curating art provides insight into some of the most socially and politically impactful curating of historical and contemporary art since the late 1990s it offers up a museological framework for understanding watershed developments of curating in art museums representing the plurality of theory and practice around the expanded field of relational curating the book focuses on curating that prioritises the quality of relationships between people and objects between institutions and people and among people it has wide international breadth with particularly strong representation in east and southeast asia including four papers never before translated into english this asian cluster illuminates the globalisation of the field and challenges dichotomies of east and west while acknowledging distinctions within specific but often transnational cultural spheres the compelling philosophical perspectives and case studies included within curating art will be of interest to students and researchers studying curating exhibition development and art museums the book will also inspire current and emerging curators to pose challenging but important questions about their own practice and the relationships that this work sustains

in recent years the term global art has become a catchphrase in contemporary art discourses going beyond additive notions of canon expansion this volume encourages a differentiated inquiry into the complex aesthetic cultural historical political epistemological and socio economic implications of both the term global art itself and the practices it subsumes focusing on diverse examples of art curating historiography and criticism the contributions not only take into account new hegemonies and exclusions but also the shifting conditions of transcultural art production circulation and reception

experimental gerontopsychology attempts to test causal hypotheses about old age related behavioral changes by the manipulation of age differences an experimental treatment is introduced with the purpose of equating different age groups with respect to a potentially relevant function if the treatment results in an assimilation of the behavior of the different age groups age by treatment interaction differences in this function are considered as causal for the normally observed behavioral difference if it does not result in an assimilation of the behavior of the different age groups main effect of treatment differences in this function are considered as irrelevant for the normally observed behavioral difference the different interpretations of age by treatment

interactions and main effects of treatment in this kind of research are reasonable only if the experimental treatment actually results in an equalization of the age groups with respect to the function of interest as is shown such a functional equalization can neither be demonstrated nor assumed in many cases in such cases studies with either age group can be used to investigate hypotheses about potential causes for old age related behavioral changes studies with young subjects having important advantages over studies with old subjects a test of causal relationships by age by treatment interactions is possible in cases where the experimental treatment evidently results in an equalization of the age groups with respect to the function in question unfortunately the field of application for this kind of approach is rather limited

thinking contemporary curating is the first publication to comprehensively explore what is distinctive about contemporary curatorial thought in five essays art historian critic and theorist terry smith surveys the international landscape of current discourse explores a number of exhibitions that show contemporaneity in present recent and post art describes the enormous growth world wide of exhibitionary infrastructure and the instability that haunts it re examines the phenomenon of artist curators and curator artists and assesses a number of key tendencies in curating such as the reimagined museum the expanded exhibition historicization and recuration infrastructural activism and engaged spectatorship as responses to contemporary conditions book cover

ever since the nineteen nineties curatorial discourse has revolved around the figure of the professional curator consequently curatorial politics is usually considered the direct result of a curator s deliberate acts and intentions now however new institutional models and modes of exhibition practice together with key shifts in funding and collecting strategies have revealed aspects of curatorial politics over which the exhibition maker has little or no control the present volume presents a series of essays by noted art theorists and cultural scientists that go beyond the perspective of the individual curator to reveal these previously unexplored levels of curatorial politics

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
