how is art criticism to be understood within an expanding artistic field a look at its history and its manifestations within globalized conditions shows the variety of the genre of the criteria and of the styles of writing this reader is an attempt to bring a diverse range of art critical voices and perspectives into conversation with each other with texts from the 18th century to the present the editors beate söntgen and julia voss have invited colleagues from various geographical and intellectual backgrounds to present and discuss the art critics of their choice choosing one example from their respective bodies of work to comment upon how have these writers approached art criticism which styles do they employ what makes them extraordinary what can we learn from their writings today and why is it important in its contemporary context beate söntgen 1963 is professor of art history at leuphana university lüneburg she studied art history philosophy and modern german literature in marburg and berlin she is director of the dfg research training group cultures of critique forms media effects and co director of the program primus doctoral studies in museums julia voss 1974 is an honorary professor at leuphana university lüneburg she studied art history modern german literature and philosophy in berlin and london she is herself an art critic and journalist and was deputy head of the arts section of the frankfurter allgemeine zeitung

this book explores a range of social institutional and discursive conditions in and through which criticism emerged and functioned in 19th century france and goes on to develop broader theoretical questions drawn from historical case studies

excerpt from elements of art criticism comprising a treatise on the principles of man s nature as addressed by art together with a historic survey of the methods of art execution in the departments of drawing sculpture architecture painting landscaping gardening and the decorative arts the following treatise on the elements of art criticism has originated in a conviction that the general neglect of early instruction in the principles of art execution is a serious defect in american education which defect may be and therefore should be removed the educated american tourist finds him self mortified amid the galleries and before the monuments of art in the old world because unlike european visitors he has no preparatory acquaintance with the first principles of art kindred to his early instruction in science and literature which would make him at

home among such treasures and fit him to appreciate to enjoy and to improve his privilege the american legislator obliged by his position to take action in meeting the great and growing demand for public expenditures in the department of painting sculpture and architecture is harassed with the apprehension that having no independent judgment of his own he may be misled by unworthy and interested men who are ever in advance of genuine artists in pressing their own claims the young american artist has rarely access to technical historical and critical treatises on art which may give clearness and comprehensiveness to his investigations and conceptions to this special lack of these several special classes must be added the general want felt by the entire mass of the american people male and female youths and adults pre eminently an educated and reading people who though supplied with elementary treatises in every department of science and philosophy search in vain in american and even in english libraries for a condensed and comprehensive work on art which shall meet their general need the demand is a peculiar one and the effort to meet it is attended with great difficulty about the publisher forgotten books publishes hundreds of thousands of rare and classic books find more at forgottenbooks.com this book is a reproduction of an important historical work forgotten books uses state of the art technology to digitally reconstruct the work preserving the original format whilst repairing imperfections present in the aged copy in rare cases an imperfection in the original such as a blemish or missing page may be replicated in our edition we do however repair the vast majority of imperfections successfully any imperfections that remain are intentionally left to preserve the state of such historical works

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at a time where there are repeated claims of the impending demise of art criticism the ends of art criticism seeks to dispel these myths by arguing that the lack of a single dominant voice in criticism is not as some believe a weakness but a strength allowing previously marginalised voices and new global and political perspectives to come to the fore an essential book for anyone interested in contemporary art criticism the ends of art criticism benefits from an author whose 30 years of experience as editor of art monthly magazine allows her to offer opinionated and thought provoking insight into the many questions and debates surrounding current critical writing on art including the relationship between artists and critics the academicisation of critical discourse and the relationship between art history and criticism

this book brings together two of the most important figures of twentieth century criticism walter benjamin and theodor adorno to consider a topic that was central to their thinking the place of and reason for art in society and culture thijs lijster takes us through points of agreement and disagreement between the two on such key topics as the relationship between art and historical experience between avant garde art and mass culture and between the intellectual and the public he also addresses the continuing relevance of benjamin and adorno to ongoing debates in contemporary aesthetics such as the end of art the historical meaning of art and the role of the critic

in 2001 art critic and historian benjamin buchloh declared the death of art criticism during the october journal s roundtable the present conditions of art criticism the following decade witnessed a plethora of articles conferences and books devoted to the crisis of criticism all efforts thus far seem to have failed the crisis has not been abated art criticism is decaying and our historical moment is not only post modern but also post critical at the same time art writing has become such a broad spectrum of literature that neither author nor reader take it seriously the writing is often ironic filled with joyful and mediocre immediacy and not to mention a proud ahistoricism we are also told however that this is a great moment for culture writings on film music and art are to be found everywhere you turn or click the internet has allowed the democratization of cultural production anyone can upload a film to youtube or a track to myspace everyone has a voice everyone has a blog and everyone is a critic under quickly changing conditions then what are the present tasks of aspiring art critics this undertaking is multilayered but it must begin with an understanding the crisis of criticism in its contemporary and historical expressions in the first two sections the thesis surveys the symptoms of the illness how art criticism has been unable to grasp the swift changes in the art world and how the curator the dealer and the collector have replaced the critic as the main mediators between art and its public the third section outlines how contemporary art criticism largely anti greenbergian and anti modern suffers from the flight from judgment in the fourth section i explain how art criticism was displaced with the emergence of art practices in the 1960s that thought to incorporate criticism into the work itself all are important and often contradictory considerations when seeking to understand the demise of art criticism but all are not equally important for the task of resurrecting and redeeming criticism the final part will dedicate itself to the future of criticism in light of its history it will investigate and introduce possible paths for the reconstitution of art criticism suggesting possibilities exist in the overlooked history of earlier art criticism

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
