over the course of the long eighteenth century a network of some fifty women writers
working in french english dutch and german staked out a lasting position in the
european literary field these writers were multilingual and lived for many years outside
of their countries of origin translated and borrowed from each others works attended
literary circles and salons and fashioned a transnational women s literature
characterized by highly recognizable codes drawing on a literary geography of national
types women writers across western europe read translated wrote and rewrote stories
about exceptional young women literary heroines who transcend the gendered destiny
of their distinctive cultural and national contexts these transcultural heroines struggle
