narcissistic behavior is one of the most prevalent disorders that is often admired and misunderstood in our society today author rudolph hall writes in his new book narcissistic behavior in the postmodern era the study of neuropsychology the diagnostic and statistical manual of mental disorders defines narcissistic personality disorder as an inflated sense of self importance and need for constant attention this book is designed to help people observe narcissistic behavior and to be aware of their own emotional behaviors as they struggle for survival and achieve favorable interaction with people of other cultures that are motivated by western values it is essential to identify narcissistic personality disorder and its trait in order to maintain homeostasis in our physical and mental processes it is important to get help and identify the behaviors appropriately in order to avoid self inflicted emotional disorders that inhibit personal achievement and limit a successful fulfilling existence throughout ones lifetime using the biopsychosocial approach to understanding human behavior hall initiates a new perspective into the psychology of everyday life

that is more reliable narcissistic behavior in the postmodern era the study of neuropsychology also aims to make psychology meaningful and relevant for introductory level students

intergenerational research is crucial in understanding long term demographic trends this book examines the ways kinship affects demographic behavior including mortality patterns to determine the influence of fertility patterns the contribution of parents longevity and the affects of a family history of disease it emphasizes the importance of studies that include and compare other factors related to social organization with information on multi generational families

human behavior and the social environment a macro national and international perspective is a textbook for one of the primary courses in the social work curriculum titled human behavior in the social environment the course is offered usually over two semesters with one focusing on micro issues how the individual develops in relation to their social environment on an individual family and group level the second section of the course typically focuses on macro issues pertaining to how an individual is shaped by their social environment by macro issues including social institutions community and the government this book is intended for the second sequence of the course it takes a unique approach by incorporating international issues of globalization which has been an emerging issue in social work although it takes this unique perspective it still covers the basics of macro social work on a national level other important areas that are not well represented in competing texts includes coverage of rural issues the impact of hurricane katrina on social and community resources human rights and social justice the increasing impact of increasing rates of incarceration and a special section focusing on crisis theory this book has a number of key selling points they include a broad national and international perspective a timely approach that examines issues such as rural communities the impact of disaster on communities and increasing incarceration rates provides special emphasis on human needs and social justice end of chapter discussion questions a student glossary chapter opening photos an appendix that includes three additional higher level macro theories which would make the book applicable to master s level program this book will also contain a number of features that are essential for any book to be

adopted in a hbse course they include end of chapter discussion questions instructor s manual featuring powerpoint slides and a test bank student study site for recommended reading chapter summaries and flash cards

in the early modern period as both reformed and catholic churches strove to articulate orthodox belief and conduct through texts sermons rituals and images communities grappled frequently with the connection between sacred space and behavior the sacralization of space and behavior in the early modern world explores individual and community involvement in the approbation reconfiguration and regulation of sacred spaces and the behavior both animal and human within them the individual s understanding of sacred space and consequently the behavior appropriate within it depended on local need group dynamics and the dissemination of normative expectations while these expectations were defined in a growing body of confessionalizing literature locally and internationally traditional clerical authorities found their decisions contested circumvented or elaborated in order to make room for other stakeholders activities and needs to clearly reveal the efforts of early modern groups to negotiate authority and the transformation of behavior with sacred space this collection presents examples that allow the deconstruction of these tensions and the exploration of the resulting campaigns within sacred space based on new archival research the eleven chapters in this collection examine diverse aspects of the campaigns to transform christian behavior within a variety of types of sacred space and through a spectrum of media these essays give voice to the arguments exhortations and accusations that surrounded the activities taking place in early modern sacred space and reveal much about how people made sense of these transformations
