with a strong emphasis on developmental theory and constructivism constructive guidance and discipline preschool and primary education explains underlying causes for child behavior weaves numerous preschool and primary classroom examples throughout and includes two chapters on guiding children with special needs this new edition features more primary grade examples and a greater emphasis on parent and community involvement instructor resources include an instructor s manual and test bank

this volume is about the normal development of adulthood as well as its vicissitudes and the contributions of such development to psychopathology the authors are psychoanalysts of great clinical skill and perceptiveness but while their focus is consistently a psychodynamic one their conceptualizations about adult developmental processes are applicable to virtually all kinds of therapy it is extraordinary how little attention has been paid to the effects of adult developmental experience on mental development obviously mental structures are not static after the profound experiences of childhood and adolescence nor are they merely a template upon which adult experiences are processed the authors clearly demonstrate that current adult experience always adds to and interacts with existing mental structure which is itself the result of all preceding development after a first section in which they examine life cycle ideas on development from antiquity to the present they present their own work as it relates to adult experience and adult development their hypoth

eses about the psychodynamic theory of adult development are particularly creative and an enormous contribution to the psychiatric literature and the clinical understanding of patients consistent with their views that development in adulthood is an ongoing and dynamic process they elaborate their ideas that childhood development is focused primarily on the formation of psychic structure while adult development is concerned with the continued evolution of existing structure and its use

parent involvement has been documented as the most effective method of improving student performance in school this book explores ideas strategies and resources that parents and teachers can use in teaming together to facilitate productive student behavior and to deal positively with discipline issues parental role in discipline is discussed in terms of three forms of parental influence 1 on the child's behavior 2 on the first learning environment and 3 on the child's attitudes the discussion of parents and teachers as copartners in discipline focuses on the need basis and process for a team approach educating parents about discipline is explored by discussing parent education with a discipline focus and orienting parents to the classroom discipline approach additionally discussed are strategies for involving parents in discipline and for dealing with special discipline situations it is concluded that teachers who use parent education and involvement strategies that focus on discipline have found them to be an important ingredient in successful classroom discipline programs parent teacher teaming is indeed a key step toward achieving more productive student behavior

this up to date and important new work describes the relationship between psychological and hormonal factors found in human sexual behavior across the lifespan the author's discussion of human sexual behavior is organized according to developmental stage starting with the fetus and concluding with senescence persky proposes that human sexual behavior is determined by a variety of factors e g social psychological and endocrine and ascertains the relative contribution of each of these factors to a range of sexual behaviors attitudes and feelings furthermore he provides documentation that these determinants are interrelated in reciprocal fashion in addition by organizing his material within the life development model persky is able to present normal and abnormal psychoendocrine relationships which lead to sexual disorders

this book offers new perspectives on the understanding of adult basic skills and literacy it identifies the critical information needs in this area and suggests ways of closing the information gap through case studies and large scale surveys the chapters give an overview of the different research and policy traditions in literacy and address key technical issues in measurement and assessment the implications and options for policy intervention are considered in light of changing conceptions of theory and measurement

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
