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medical care is an industry and private providers and hospitals are the major service providers they operate on business principles hospitals are getting highly specialized and complex the diagnostics and therapeutics are technology intensive private establishments have to compete with one another to remain in business they strive to induct the best talent and latest technical know how resulting in ever increasing costs to patients patients who pay high charges demand quality
