first published in 1991 this book consists of 13 articles that were originally published in the journal anxiety research they address the topic of anxiety and self focused attention from a variety of perspectives representing recent advances in social clinical and personality psychology at the time as a whole the book poses a stimulating theoretical challenge to traditional anxiety research which had been dominated by psychometric issues clinical case studies and stable personality constructs the contributors share the view that anxiety is an emotional state of distress dependent upon specific antecedent cognitive processes such as self awareness perceived role discrepancy or unfavourable expectancies

this volume is currently the only textbook devoted to the study of the self republished in its original form by psychology press in 2007 it carefully documents the changing conceptions and the value accorded the self in psychology over time

pritchard provides a deliberate and convincing argument for a starting point for the discussion of moral development on in which self regard and empathy provide equally essential groundings for individual morality drawing essential elements from the work of reid strawson rawls kohlberg and gilligan he builds a comprehensive framework for tracing moral development from childhood one that allows human morality to be grounded in both reason and emotion and that recognizes the importance to morality of justice and rights as well as caring and responsibility

introduction and research review background of the study a society constitutes a large group of individuals with diversities who live together and are involved in continuous social interactions the social interaction of people leads to the formation of different social groups within a society thus society is a network or web of complex mutual interaction and inter relations that exist between and among the members of the groups people living in society have similarities and differences in terms of their values beliefs languages rituals behaviour race religion and many other factors the diversity of people within society gives birth to different social constructs and people are classified based on the similarity of these social constructs the human being is biologically and psychologically driven to live in association with other fellow beings and cannot live in isolation an individual is dependent on the society for his her existence and survival and thereby determines one s personality the process of socialization helps an individual to discover and identify his her sense of self and personality while interacting with other individuals thus society influences an individual s physical and mental development it shapes one s attitudes beliefs and morals the concept of social categorization is also an important aspect of society that leads to the notion of in group and out group turner 2010 in group is a group with which individuals identify themselves based on similar behaviours attitudes and beliefs and out group is a group with which individuals

beere has produced a new edition of her women and women s issues a handbook of tests and measurements based largely on a search of the psychlit and eric databases from january 1978 to december 1988 the volume includes information on 211 tests and measures pertaining to gender roles and attitudes towards gender particularly useful are chapter reviews of the literature in which the author reviews the quality of available research recommended for college and university libraries choice this handbook stems in part from the author s previously published women and women s issues realizing that a book published in 1979 could no longer

provide researchers with the up to date information they require regarding measures to use in research beere set out to revise and update her work in the process she soon discovered that the measures identified through her search of the literature produced since her first book was published far exceeds the number that can be realistically described in a single handbook thus she has undertaken a two volume guide the first of which gender roles describes only those measures pertaining to gender roles and attitudes toward gender related issues gender roles are broadly defined to include adults and children s gender roles gender stereotypes marital roles parental roles employee roles and multiple roles a total of 211 measures are included in addition to 67 scales still in use that were described in her earlier book beere includes scales that are relevant have evidence of their reliability and or validity and are used in more than one published article or eric document if a scale does not satisfy these criteria but its development is the focus of an article or eric document it is included as are scales that are unusual or pertain to a topic that would otherwise receive inadequate coverage in this handbook the scale descriptions follow a standard format that includes the following information title author or authors as listed in the earliest publication mentioning the scale earliest date that the scale is mentioned in a publication profile of variable being measured type of instrument description sample items previous and appropriate subjects scoring information a description of the development of the measure information regarding reliability and validity and a listing of published studies that use the measure this important new handbook promises to make several important contributions to gender related research it will make it easier for researchers to locate quality instruments appropriate for their research discourage the proliferation of substandard or redundant measures set some minimal standards for measures used in gender role research and encourage more research regarding gender roles all social science libraries will want to find a place for it in their reference collections
