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horror films provide a guide to many of the sociological fears of the cold war era in an age when warning audiences of impending death was the order of the day for popular nonfiction horror films provided an area where this fear could be lived out to its ghastly conclusion because enemies and potential situations of fear lurked everywhere within the home the government the family and the very self horror films could speak to the invasive fears of the cold war era i was a cold war monster examines cold war anxieties as they were reflected in british and american films from the fifties through the early sixties this study examines how cold war horror films combined anxiety over social change with the erotic in such films as psycho the tingler the horror of dracula and house of wax

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the 1950s are widely regarded as the golden age of american science fiction this book surveys a wide range of major science fiction novels and films from the long 1950s the period from 1946 to 1964 when the tensions of the cold war were at their peak the american science fiction novels and films of this period clearly reflect cold war anxieties and tensions through their focus on such themes as alien invasion and nuclear holocaust in this sense they resemble the observations of social and cultural critics during the same period meanwhile american science fiction of the long 1950s also engages its historical and political contexts through an interrogation of phenomena such as alienation and routinization that can be seen as consequences of the development of american capitalism during this period this economic trend is part of the rise of the global phenomenon that marxist theorists have called late capitalism thus american science fiction during this period reflects the rise of late capitalism and participates in the beginnings of postmodernism described by frederic jameson as the cultural logic of late capitalism

from the postapocalyptic world of blade runner to the james cameron mega hit terminator tech noir has emerged as a distinct genre with roots in both the promethean myth and the earlier popular traditions of gothic detective and science fiction in this new volume many well known film and literary works including the matrix robocop and mary shelley s frankenstein are discussed with reference to their relationship to tech noir and one another featuring an extensive clearly indexed filmography tech noir film will be of great interest to anyone wishing to learn more about the development of this new and highly innovative genre

this work provides a critical overview of monster magazines from the 1950s to the 1970s the term monster magazine is a blanket term which for the purposes of this study is used to describe both magazines that focus primarily on popular horror movies and magazines that contain stories featuring monsters which are illustrated in comic book style but printed in black and white
