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squeezed between more powerful france and spain catalonia has endured a violent history its medieval empire that conquered naples sicily and athens was crushed by spain its geography with the pyrenees falling sharply to the rugged costa brava is tormented too michael eaude traces this history and its monuments roman tarragona celebrated by the poet martial greek empuries lost for centuries beneath the sands medieval romanesque architecture in the vall de boi churches a world heritage site and poblet and santes creus monasteries he tells the stories of several of catalonia s great figures abbot oliva who brought moorish learning to europe the ruthless mercenary roger de flor and verdaguer handsome poet priest catalonia is famous today for its twentieth century art this book focuses on the revolutionary art nouveau buildings including the sagrada familia of antoni gaudi it also explores the region s artistic legacy the young picasso painting barcelona s vibrant slums salvador dali inspired by the twisted rocks of cap de creus to paint his landscapes of the human mind and joan miro discovering the colours of the red earth at montroig

focusing on high end cuisine this book examines the flows of culinary knowledge from culturally peripheral locations to two cities at the global center london and new york through

the voices of chefs and other professionals in the industry this book invites readers to rethink our understandings of high end and ethnic cuisines as well as the conventions and principles that shape the contemporary field of gastronomy and fine dining it examines a broad range of cuisines including peruvian korean mexican malaysian senegalese west african thai chinese and indian and conveys the chefs voices as they strive to elevate their cuisines through discursive and material means including the shaping of menus and restaurant decor while the main focus falls on chefs as the producers of high end cuisines this book also gives consideration to their consumers that is cosmopolitan diners in the two global cities and to the influence of culinary intermediaries judging and legitimizing their high end status theoretically this book contributes to the debate on cultural globalization it undertakes a study of hitherto rarely examined cultural counterflows or reverse cultural globalization and analyzes both the precipitants of this occurrence and the effects of cultural counterflows on both western global cities and the home countries of chefs this book will be of great interest to students and scholars of food studies food cultures cultural globalization and culinary studies

the aim of this text is to provide a social history of the babas in singapore it describes and analyzes social political and cultural aspects of their identities by taking into account the conceptual history of baba designations from 1819 1994 it argues that defining the babas is misleading it is more meaningful to adopt a socio historical approach that differentiates spatiotemporally distinct baba identities such an approach is usually avoided not only in research on the babas but in many other sociological anthropological or historical studies it concludes that there is no such thing as a baba identity it has always been in flux and needs to be reconstructed taking seriously the conceptual history the two crucial turning points in the history of the babas namely the japanese occupation 1942 1945 and self rule 1959 led to public emphasis on their culture prior emphasis on their former status as a political and economic elite have been hitherto neglected taking into account all aspects legal political economic cultural linguistic religious of baba identities leads us to a fascinating trajectory of a potential group

elegantly written by a distinguished culinary historian food is culture explores the innovative premise that everything having to do with food its capture cultivation preparation and consumption represents a cultural act even the choices made by primitive hunters and gatherers were determined by a culture of economics availability and medicine digestibility and nutrition that led to the development of specific social structures and traditions massimo montanari begins with the invention of cooking which allowed humans to transform natural edible objects into cuisine cooking led to the creation of the kitchen the adaptation of raw materials into utensils and the birth of written and oral guidelines to formalize cooking techniques like roasting broiling and frying the transmission of recipes allowed food to acquire its own language and grow into a complex cultural product shaped by climate geography the pursuit of pleasure and later the desire for health in his history montanari touches on the spice trade the first agrarian societies renaissance dishes that synthesized different tastes and the analytical attitude of the enlightenment which insisted on the separation of flavors brilliantly researched and analyzed he shows how food once a practical necessity evolved into an indicator of social standing and religious and political identity whether he is musing on the origins of the fork the symbolic power of meat cultural attitudes toward hot and cold foods the connection between cuisine and class the symbolic significance of certain foods or the economical consequences of religious holidays montanari s concise yet intellectually rich reflections add another dimension to the history of human civilization entertaining and surprising food is culture is a fascinating look at how food is the ultimate embodiment of our continuing attempts to tame transform and reinterpret nature
