the experiences of both black patients and the black mental health professionals who serve them are analyzed against the backdrop of the cultural societal and professional forces that have shaped their place in this specialized health care arena

more than 3 400 colleges and universities in the united states serve 20 5 million students while each campus is unique most campuses and institutions face common issues including tenure and promotion budgeting competition among disciplines for space and funding academic bullying and issues of identity these are just a few of the topics among the many vital areas of concern at schools across the country in bridges not blockades personal essays related to these cultural and political matters will allow faculty and administrators in higher education to see hear and

better understand the inner workings of our institutions perhaps more importantly this book demonstrates that faculty and staff at colleges and universities need to embrace our commonalities so that we can meet the challenges of higher education throughout the 21st century indeed some of these essays may suggest ways in which faculty staff and administrators have moved from differences to commitment to shared goals to tackle new and existing challenges and opportunities perfect for courses such as higher education leadership and policy leading institutional change ethics in educational leadership organization and administration of higher education leadership and learning in organizations leadership and organizational performance equity and diversity in higher education negotiation in educational leadership

while much recent attention has been focused on the subprime lending and foreclosure crisis little has been said about its radically disparate impact drawing upon history as well as insight into the current crisis this book shows that this crisis is not an anomaly especially for people of

color nor is it over people of color have been excluded from wealth building opportunities via homeownership continuously throughout united states history from the outright denial of credit and residential racial discrimination to federally sponsored urban renewal programs the subprime lending and foreclosure crisis is predicted to strip a quarter of a trillion dollars in wealth from black and latino homeowners it has reversed home ownership gains for people of color and has decimated neighborhoods across the united states while impacting local regional national and international economies the consequences are devastating this collection of essays provides a framework for creating equitable policy and ultimately building more stable communities for all americans

the field of affordable housing and community economic development in the united states has evolved since the 1960s it has become a solid and complex industry building healthy communities a guide to community economic development for advocates lawyers and policymakers documents the themes and trends of the contemporary movement and provides guidance for strengthening our communities and ensuring that they and their residents prosper in today s global economy

race and coalition is volume 1 number 2 of the journal race ethnicity it reflects continuing attention by scholars and advocates to the theoretical and practical features of coalition building contributors engage topics that include the challenges and opportunities racially marginalized groups face in trying to work together the mobilization of transnational networks in multiracial organizing the simultaneous use and critique of white privilege multiracial organizing against the rights of other marginalized populations and the unintended effects of coalition building

architecture is often thought to be a diary of a society filled with symbolic representations of specific cultural moments however as craig l wilkins observes that diary includes far too few narratives of the diverse cultures in u s society wilkins states that the discipline of architecture has a resistance to african americans at every level from the startlingly small number of architecture students to the paltry number of registered architects in the united states today working to understand how ideologies are formed transmitted and embedded in the built environment wilkins deconstructs how the marginalization of african americans is authorized within the field of architecture he then outlines how activist forms of expression shape and sustain communities fashioning an architectural theory around the site of environmental conflict constructed by hip hop culture wilkins places his concerns in a historical context and also offers practical solutions to address them in doing so he reveals new possibilities for an architecture that acknowledges its current shortcomings and replies to the needs of
