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talk of repair has become ubiquitous in recent years in the age of trauma culture art and literature have a new purpose to do justice to console comfort and heal drawing on works of twenty first century french language literature this monograph shows how literature can not only serve as a means of personal development but expand our capacity for empathy help repair the brokenness implied in victimhood and redress individual and collective traumas centered on a critical reflection on discourses of repair and reparations it questions the canonical theories on the functions of literature and proposes a new way of writing and reading literary history praise repair the world is an invigorating and essential call to arms the modern category of the literary it declares is being outpaced by the contemporary uses of literature as a medium of exorcism empathy reparation testimony commemoration existential renewal and ethical or political connectivity neither celebrating nor condemning such uses gefen models a much needed style of criticism interdisciplinary pragmatic relational that comes to grips with their importance rita felski the john stewart bryan professor and professor of english at the university of virginia usa in an era where self help memoir and autobiography command more than their fair share of publisher s lists in france it s tempting some fifty years after post structuralism s heyday to ascribe an impending death of literature to a taste for narcissistic exhibitionism in french literary culture but why bemoan the waning relevance of the question what is literature asks alexandre gefen when evidence abounds in the new century that literary writing increasingly posits itself as a restorative reparative act in the best instances authors who give form to embodied experience imaginatively forge with their readers empathetic bonds of the sort that secular and religious institutions long sustained repair the world is not only a capacious study of writers who hail from surprisingly broad sectors of french society from health and social workers to skilled laborers journalists and educators it s a situated call for a pragmatics of reading that makes of each book an intervention into the fabric of the real harnessing sources in affect theory trauma studies ethics and cognitive science alexandre gefen performs a critically reparative act all his own reminding us that the notion of literature as autonomous object was itself a historical construct in short an ideology reading and writing have always conjoined care for the self and care for others and it s upon that reciprocity that the communities of sense of tomorrow can flourish in a spirit of reparative humanism derek schilling professor of french director of the centre louis marin department of modern languages and literatures johns hopkins university usa alexandre gefen s wide ranging thought provoking study takes stock of a paradigm shift in contemporary french literature away from a model of autonomy and intransitivity to ways of writing and reading that seek to repair restore reassure and rebuild from the varied forms of expressivity found in self narratives to the empathetic projections of fiction repair the world maps out an expanding literary territory that seeks not critical negativity but rather the power to intervene for good in individual and collective life while reserving judgment on the

actual extent of literature's effects gefen demonstrates that contemporary projects and discourses undeniably center the therapeutic and remediative uses of literature with its nuanced readings and keen insights repair the world has been rightly influential in france its powerful diagnosis of contemporary sensibilities resonates far beyond revealing both the promises and predicaments of literature in the twenty first century alison james professor of french and chair of the department of romance languages and literatures at the university of chicago usa what would it mean to ask sartre's post war question what is literature in the 21st century in this wonderful essay alexandre gefen argues convincingly that the main purpose of literature today is to repair a broken world and memorialise forgotten lives taking examples from predominantly contemporary french literature he proposes that literature as therapy has replaced religions of salvation a politics of emancipation and formal experimentation today literature's mission is to heal traumatised individuals and communities resurrect the lives of the vulnerable and commemorate their deeds in the face of the forces of oblivion for gefen patrick modiano's *dora Bruder* 1997 is the contemporary literary archetype of these lost identities to be rehabilitated and reinhabited gefen describes this new role for literature without taking sides the writing is lucid compelling and non partisan in an age of victimhood testimony empathy self expression and identity gefen's reparative paradigm is as persuasive as sartre's political version in the age of ideology max silverman professor of modern french studies university of leeds uk

explores the state of french fiction through an examination of the work of five major french writers annie ernaux pascal quignard marie darrieussecq jean echenoz and patrick modiano this book deals with some of the writers on british and american university french courses

in the face of the contested legacy of engagement in the francophone context this interdisciplinary collection demonstrates that french and francophone writers artists intellectuals and film makers are using their work to confront unforeseen and unprecedented challenges campaigns and causes in a politically uncertain post 9 11 world composed of eleven essays and a contextualising introduction this volume is interdisciplinary in its treatment of engagement in a variety of forms as it reassesses the relationship between different types of cultural production and society as it is played out in the twenty first century with a focus on both the development of different cultural forms part 1 and on the particular crises that have attracted the attention of cultural practitioners part 2 this volume maps and analyses some of the ways in which cultural texts of all kinds are being used to respond to engage with and challenge crises in the contemporary francophone world

the essays in this volume provide an overview and critical account of prevalent trends and theoretical arguments informing current investigations into literary treatments of motherhood and aging they explore how two key stages in women's lives maternity and old age are narrated and defined in fictions and autobiographical writings by contemporary french and francophone women through close readings of maryse condé hélène cixous zahia rahmani linda lê pierrette fleutieux and michèle sarde among others these essays examine related topics such as dispossession female friendship and women's relationships with their mothers by adopting a broad synthetic approach to these two distinct and defining stages in women's lives this volume elucidates how these significant transitional moments set the stage for women's evolving definitions and interrogations of their identities and roles

a long overdue reinterpretation and appreciation of the Peutinger map as a masterpiece both of mapmaking and imperial Roman ideology

a study based on a set of filmed interviews with francophone women writers in Paris that explores the literary phenomenon of an unprecedented number of women from around the world who have moved to Paris and become authors of written works in French

this is the only modern scholarly biography of Catiline based on an exhaustive study of the ancient sources and modern scholarship Lucius Sergius Catilina Catiline was a Roman aristocrat from a poor but noble family he was a controversial figure both in his own times and in subsequent historical scholarship Catiline was cast first as the Roman equivalent of Richard III and later as a left-wing revolutionary depending on the times and historians' leanings although Catiline's calls for debt relief and other measures in his second consular campaign earned him support from the poor the author finds that Catiline was motivated by pride and ambition rather than by an interest in widespread social and economic reforms embittered by his failure to attain the consulship which he thought was his due given his heritage he had his lieutenant Manlius raise armed forces in Etruria while he planned to stage a coup in Rome when these forces approached the city the conspiracy was betrayed to Cicero Cicero skillfully used his knowledge of the conspiracy to force Catiline to leave Rome and join Manlius leaving the city conspirators without effective leadership Catiline's urban lieutenants soon blundered by seeking to enlist the support of a Gallic tribe whose emissaries were in the city the Gauls skeptical of the conspirators' leadership decided to report all that they had learned about the conspirators' plans to Cicero using the evidence obtained from the Gauls Cicero presented a prosecutor's case against the conspirators to the Senate and rallied public opinion against the Catilinians Cicero then executed five of the key conspirators without trial when Catiline's soldiers learned of the destruction of the urban conspiracy many deserted Catiline finding his army trapped between two larger government forces died fighting in a fierce but doomed battle at Pistoria

a bilingual collection of essays on the aesthetics of gilles deleuze discern e ments highlights what is at stake in deleuzian philosophy of art it traces the reception of deleuzian thought in a broad range of disciplines and gauges its use value in each of them following the dynamics between structure and becoming that punctuates deleuzian aesthetics discern e ments sketches and erases boundaries between methods and traditions in philosophy and art theory as well as in literary performance and film studies offering both numerous case studies as well as theoretical outlines discern e ments engages faculties disciplines and criticisms not in a mere exchange of points of view but in heterogenesis mapping out further discernments in deleuzian aesthetics

much of francophone literature is a response to an elaborate discourse that served to bolster colonial french notions of national grandeur and to justify expansion of french territories overseas a form of colonial exoticism saw the colonized subject as a physical cultural aesthetic and even sexual singularity francophone writers sought to rehabilitate the status of non western peoples who through the use of anthropometric techniques had been racially classified as inferior or primitive drawing on various francophone texts this collection of new essays offers a compelling study of the literary body both corporeal and figurative topics include the embodiment of diasporic identity the body politic in prison writing women s bodies and the body s expression of trauma inflicted by genocidal violence

alexander the great was one of the legendary nine worthies in the medieval canon of ancient and modern heroes and medieval writers exploited his legend in a wide variety of literary and didactic texts addressing the classical legacy to the middle ages as expressed in four centuries of vernacular narratives this volume offers the first systematic collective study of alexander the great s thematic prominence in medieval culture contributors from britain france the netherlands and the united states combine sensitive textual analyses with perspectives from such diverse fields as art history codicology anthropology sociology the history of mentalities and postcolonial theory overall the collection offers a provocative rethinking of the monumental medieval french tradition of alexander the great as well as valuable insight into the emergence and transformations of french literature between the early twelfth century and the end of the middle ages
