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between the ages of one and three children go through a distinct stage that every parent knows well toddlerhood primarily concerned with themselves and their immediate worlds toddlers present special needs to their caregivers this book outlines a responsive nondirective approach to help professionals with this unique developmental stage the authors approach is child centered focusing on the need to let children

be themselves in as natural and individual a way as possible rather than stressing preschool academic achievement responsive caregiving adjusting to the specific needs of the children requires as much knowledge of psychology sociology education and medicine as directive caregiving but in addition the responsive caregiver needs a rarer higher skill an ability to follow the toddler's lead back cover

this volume extends the knowledge base supporting research informed child care for infants and toddlers while simultaneously highlighting areas of study ripe for future research the authors demonstrate from a systems perspective that the experiences and outcomes of very young children in child care are influenced by characteristics of and interactions between the children adults and settings varying methodological approaches as well as the utilization of newer data collection instruments inform the field's understanding of current practices and procedures while offering guidance for future programming and policy in turn the chapters highlight a plethora of open questions and a need for a new generation of research to support the field of infant toddler care future challenges are evident in the recognition of the inadequate nature of our current measures of child outcomes and classroom processes the field's unmet promise to incorporate interdisciplinary perspectives and the need for newer methodological designs that blend the strengths of quantitative and qualitative approaches these issues are important given the growing demand for infant toddler care and the increasing recognition of the unique role of this age period in serving as the foundation for all later development this book was originally published as a special issue of early education and development

an increasing number of people in our country today acknowledge the fact that there is an enormous crisis in the field of early child care the first chapter of this book examines the major reasons for the crisis and why the economic reality for most american households will cause the problem to continue to grow in the coming years following this the second chapter discusses the criteria of a good early child care setup based on professional literature in the field and the author's experience the remainder of the book addresses the serious problem that most day care workers are very poorly trained for their jobs six chapters are devoted to providing a practical guide for people who work with young children they discuss from current research in the field but without using technical language current practical methods of working with children at risk or those who may potentially be at risk the focus is on working with children in groups helping day care workers and substitute parents to minimize or remediate the at risk factor in the children in their care the book also addresses parents of these children and emphasizes the need for cooperation between day care workers and them so that child care providers can effectively convey the skills presented here there is also a chapter on approaches to working with special children such as children with autism and those with physical or neurological impairments this informative and sensitive book will be useful in advancing the training of workers in infant and early child care settings
