traditionally sought to provide an entertaining spectacle for years this has been typified by
parades bands mock battles drill displays and other relevant feats of military prowess which
have captured the imagination of the public and inspired potential recruits the 20th century
brought a new dimension to the field of warfare and subsequently added a new strand to
the fabric of public ceremony and displays by the armed forces that new dimension was the
arrival of powered flight display flying began within five years of the wright brothers
making their milestone first flight the first events staged in britain which centered on
demonstrations by flying machines were organized by the town councils of blackpool and
doncaster and were held within days of each other in october 1909 1920 was the year that
the first of the famed and legendary hendon air pageants was staged and this is where

military air shows traditionally began the hendon displays were organized and staged by the still fledgling royal air force and it was probably due in no small part to the prestige and spectacle of this fresh new dimension of military pageantry together with other like events held at raf airfields through the next two decades that the very existence of the raf was saved from the threat of abolition the history of the raf's commitment one that compares almost uniquely with other air forces toward display flying through the years after world war ii has now come of age this account of their record in this often overlooked but then again traditional field of military customs describes and illustrates the major public raf events since 1920

includes 21 maps diagrams and 17 illustrations photos the royal air force is the oldest independent air force in the world having gained its spurs over the trenches of flanders in the first world war it was officially established in 1918 however it was during the second world war that it would achieve its greatest successes yet from an inauspicious start following post war budget cuts it would rise to become a decisive factor in the campaign to remove the nazis from europe and the japanese from mainland asia the three volume official history gives a sound and broad narrative of all of the campaigns actions and engagements that the royal air force was party to across europe asia africa and australasia the text was set out in manageable chapters each dealing with a particular episode of the struggle against fascism and is written in an easy and accessible style free from the specialised vocabulary of flying or aerial combat the first volume covers the period 1939 1942 including the initial phoney war period the norway expedition the battle of france the battle of britain the blitz the opening stages of the battle of the atlantic the opening stages of the north african campaign

the leyland titan was the last double deck bus to have at least some hand in its design by the old london transport suffering in the early 1970s from the reliability problems of the dms class of daimler fleetline and no longer able to design and build its own buses london transport resolved not to be caught out twice thus was developed the leyland titan an attractive amenable and reliable second generation opo bus that entered revenue earning service on 4 december 1978 with 1 125 bought new and six acquired second hand the t class went on to complete nearly 25 years on the london frontline although its technological sophistication combined with industrial problems afflicting leyland at the time put off buyers outside the capital the privatised descendants of these same concerns would snap up second hand titans when the tendering losses incurred by london buses ltd caused examples to flood onto the open market in some cases after less than ten years of service many of them would go straight back into service on london routes the t class saw london through the uncertain period of division and privatisation and in the hands of three successor companies to london buses ltd continued to provide stalwart service until 19 june 2003 when t1018 operated on a stage service for the last time with all remaining examples including those latterly used on schools and private hire work now gone from frontline service the future careers of the london transport titans have been no less fascinating with buses seeing use by operators large and small the length and breadth of the country in the london titan matthew wharmby explores in detail the complete history of the last of the bespoke london transport buses illustrated throughout with over 300 colour and black and white photographs this book will appeal to the many bus enthusiasts around the country

the inter war years between 1918 and 1939 saw the newly created royal air force fighting for its very existence politically being dispatched to the remotest corners of the british empire

and its protectorates in various policing roles and then finally engaged in a headlong rush to modernize in the face of the new german fascist regime that was threatening british and european freedom yet this important period in raf history and its effect on political and military rationale during the period has never been completely documented this exhaustive and comprehensive reference is the most detailed work to be published on the subject the author gives full information on the changing structure of the force during the period squadron operations political machinations and their effects the airplanes and their equipment the personnel technical advances in navigation and breakthroughs achieved in engine performance the book is cross referenced throughout extremely well illustrated and contains an abundance of location maps and other diagrams this book will become a bible for anyone interested in the history of the raf this work has been reviewed by personnel at the raf historical branch who praise it

ian philpott presents us here with a compendium of facts operational histories and photo illustrations combined to create a comprehensive account of the early years of the royal air force illustrated throughout it features details of all military operations from 1914 to 1918 which impacted upon the organisation also included are operational details of the independent bomber force throughout 1918 a supplementary historical strand that is sure to appeal to aviation enthusiasts with a taste for features of niche focus details of the airfields landing grounds seaplane bases and various other landmarks of this era are given and readers are encouraged to use the work as a reference book being as it is a weighty tome of encyclopedic scope sure to make a welcome addition to any aviation enthusiasts library this well researched piece of work has been a long time in the making philpott brings his typical flare to the project leaving no stone unturned when it comes to this dynamic defining period of royal air force history as featured in the east kent mercury and essence magazine

throughout the relatively short yet highly distinguished history of the royal air force there has been a tendency for the men and women of the service to be overshadowed by the glamour of the aircraft nonetheless it is surprising that there has never before been a complete record of the uniforms and badges of the raf and its predecessor the royal flying corps malcolm hobart and pen and sword books have cooperated to rectify this serious omission with this superbly color illustrated and comprehensive collector s guide badges of rank and trade are all depicted not only for the flying arms but for ground staff this valuable addition to our collector series also covers the raf reserves and auxiliary service air training corps and the royal observer corps

in 1918 the royal air force became the first major independent air force in the world formed to serve a strategic need in the most intensive war that britain had then fought the raf continued in the inter war era to play a key role in the political and diplomatic world and in defending the empire during the second world war the raf was pivotal in defending britain from invasion in the battle of britain and then in leading the assault on the axis powers most notably through the contentious bomber offensive against germany in the post war world the raf adapted and developed into a force to meet the needs of the united kingdom during the cold war the retreat from empire and most recently in the move to coalition warfare against low intensity threats all against a backdrop of diminishing resources and shifting priorities this is the story of the raf over the first century of its existence how it has confronted the many challenges and threats it has faced from the luftwaffe in 1940 through the spectre of nuclear holocaust in the cold war to the fight against terrorism in the 21st

century and how it has contributed to the defence of the united kingdom throughout that period

includes pictures includes contemporary accounts includes online resources and a bibliography for further reading one of the most important breakthroughs in military technology associated with world war i and certainly the one that continues to capture the public imagination was the use of airplanes which were a virtual novelty a decade before while the war quickly ground to a halt in its first few months the skies above the western front became increasingly busy the great powers had already been acquiring aircraft for potential uses but given that aerial warfare had never been a major component of any conflict it s understandable that few on either side had any idea what the planes were capable of doing furthermore at the start of the war all sides aircraft were ill equipped for combat mostly because the idea that planes might somehow fight was still a novel one and the adaptations had not yet been developed that would allow the aerial battles later in the war as a result aircraft were used almost entirely for reconnaissance early on allowing generals to gain unprecedented levels of information about enemy movements such intelligence allowed the french to counter german movements in what became the first battle of the marne ending germany s hopes for victory through the schlieffen plan similarly in the east german planes were vital in tracking encircling and destroying russian forces at tannenberg some armies such as the french saw air intelligence as a strategic matter with aircraft capable mainly of identifying enemy forces before battle and contributing to advanced preparations the germans on the other hand believed that aircraft could provide tactical information once battle had commenced pilots such as oswald boelcke germany s first great aerial officer would fly over enemy positions in two seat aircraft with a spotter in the back identifying allied positions and using colored lights to direct the fire of artillery on the ground of course spotting took on great importance because of the growing range and power of artillery much of the fire from the great guns was aimed indirectly since the

gunners could not see their targets and thus relied on intelligence from others to direct them maps of enemy held territory were often woefully inadequate to start with and with the need to know where moving enemy formations were positioned the business gained an added complexity but aircraft could cut through this by providing up to date intelligence on enemy positions and sending it back to the gun batteries which were lobbing shells over their own front lines the royal air force raf britain s legendary air arm was born in the skies above the first world war the british had previously used balloons for spotting and reconnaissance for decades and in the years leading up to the war planes started seeing military use they mostly provided reconnaissance though experiments were made in using them offensively during the boer war of 1899 1902 the british army used the crews of helium filled balloons to plot and help target artillery fire but these were small tentative steps the first patent to fit a machine gun to a plane taken out in 1910 had not yet led to active fighting vehicles and there was no doctrine no tactics and no combat between massed air fleets that changed during world war i as the skies above the western front became the crucible in which the preceding fragments of aerial warfare were smelted in the white hot heat of war for the british this meant the creation of a large and unified flying force which by 1918 would become the raf the birth of the royal air force in world war i the history and legacy of british air power during the great war examines the creation and evolution of the raf over the course of world war i

by early 1941 the war raged in europe and great britain stood alone against the aerial might of nazi germany although much of the royal air force s pilot training program had been relocated to canada and other dominion countries the need for pilots remained acute the british looked to the united states for possible assistance passage of the lend lease act in march 1941 allowed for the training of british pilots in the united states and the formation of british flying training schools these unique schools were owned by american operators staffed with american civilian instructors supervised by british royal air force officers utilized aircraft supplied by the u s army air corps and used the raf training syllabus within these pages tom killebrew provides the first comprehensive history of all seven british flying training schools located in terrell texas lancaster california miami oklahoma mesa arizona clewiston florida ponca city oklahoma and sweetwater texas the first british students arrived in a still neutral united states in june 1941 many had never been in an airplane or even driven an automobile but they mastered the elements of flight attended ground school classes were introduced to the mysteries of the link trainer and instrument flight and then ventured out on cross country exercises students began night flying with the natural apprehension associated with taking off into a black sky aided by only a few instruments a flickering flare path and limited ground references some students failed the periodic check flights and had to be eliminated from training while others were killed during mishaps and are buried in local cemeteries those who finished the course became royal air force pilots but the story of the british flying training schools is more than the story of young men learning to fly these young british students would also forge a strong and long lasting bond of friendship with the americans they came to know this bond would last not only during training but would continue throughout the war and still exist long after the end of the war

while the united states sought to remain neutral in the early years of world war ii some americans did not this book is the first to provide the operational records and combat reports of the three american eagle royal air force squadrons units comprised of volunteer american pilots who served with the british prior to the u s entering the war the records tell the story of the more than 200 pilots who against federal law flew with the british in their

fight against nazi germany while some americans served individually in other raf units these three squadrons the 71st 121st and 133rd were the only ones organized exclusively for americans they were the first of dozens of american fighter squadrons that would soar over europe

an incredible life that spanned for nearly a century robert collins blackmore or blackie as he was known in the raf grew up as a sickly child but would soon become one of the unsung heroes of world war two stricken with family tragedy the young blackmore continued with his fascination with anything mechanical only to find more hardships to follow honoured with the atlantic star for bravery burned in a freak engine room explosion and meeting winston churchill on a cold and sinister night are just some aspects of this humble unpretentious man this is the story of one man's fight for survival lost love and an inner strength to knuckle down and get the job done bob left the raf to enjoy the rest of his life with his wife jacque until his passing in 2009 at the age of 92 excerpt bang my right knee was torn apart as i was blown past the starboard engine gear lever i was thrown out of the engine room over the well deck and smashed into the cabin entrance bob blackmore

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
