originally published in 1995 in the beautiful novel and strange ronald paulson fills a lacuna in studies of aesthetics at its point of origin in england in the 1700s he shows how aesthetics took off not only from british empiricism but also from such forms of religious heterodoxy as deism the third earl of shaftesbury the founder of aesthetics replaced the christian god of rewards and punishments with beauty worship of god with a taste for a work of art william hogarth reacting against shaftesbury's disinterestedness replaced his platonic abstractions with an aesthetics centered on the human body

gendered female and based on an epistemology of curiosity pursuit and seduction paulson shows hogarth creating first in practice and then in theory a middle area between the beautiful and the sublime by adapting joseph addison s category in the spectator of the novel uncommon and strange paulson retrieves an aesthetics that had strong support during the eighteenth century but has been obscured both by the more dominant academic discourse of shaftesbury and later sir joshua reynolds and by current trends in art and literary history arguing that the two traditions comprised not only painterly but also literary theory and practice paulson explores the innovations of henry fielding john cleland laurence Sterne and oliver goldsmith which followed and complemented the practice in the visual arts of hogarth and his followers

this book examines the conceptual existential and logical conditions under which the philosophical novel can be treated as a literary genre on a par with generally recognized literary genres such as mystery romantic adventure religious or historical novel michael h mitias argues that the philosophical novel meets these conditions he advances a detailed analysis of the concept of literary genre and discusses the reasons which justify the claim that philosophical novel is a distinct literary genre this is based on the assumption that philosophical ideas can be communicated metaphorically an analysis of this assumption necessarily leads to a detailed discussion of the concept of metaphor and the extent to which it can be the vehicle of communicating philosophical truth

this pathologization of reading with a profusion of novels addressed to young male readers paradoxically proposing their own novels as potential cures in the early twentieth century this corpus was critically revisited by a new generation of writers victims of the book shows how gide and proust in particular reworked the fin de si cle paradox to subvert cultural norms about literature and masculinity proposing instead a queer pact between writer and reader
