this volume presents a collection of critical essays that center women s friendship in women s literary and artistic production analyzing cultural portrayals of women s friendships in fiction letters and film these essays collectively suggest new models of literary interpretation that do not prioritize heterosexual romance instead this book represents friendships as mature and meaningful relationships that contribute to identity formation and political coalition both the supportive and competitive aspects of friendships are shown to be crucial to women s identities as individuals political citizens and artists addressing the complexities of how 20th and 21st century cultural texts construe women s friendships as they navigate patriarchal institutions this collection advances scholarship on friendship beyond men and masculine models

this volume examines the ways in which trauma alters women's identities while some of the chapters look deeply at individual experiences many of the contributions look to national traumas and the consequences of political abuses including colonial subjugation and genocide for women the book shows that language has a transformative power to change us to give us a great capacity for inner and outer dialogues and for healing and self love as shown here women have historically employed autobiography and memoir to free themselves and others rather than seeing the limit of form they reinvent the parameters to offer a new relationship with language

2013 and images of the modern vampire the hip and the atavistic fairleigh dickinson university press 2013 focused on the vampire legend the essays in this collection expand that scope to include a multicultural and multigeneric discussion of a pantheon of supernatural creatures who interact and cross species specific boundaries with ease angels and demons are discussed from the perspective of supernatural allegory angelic ethics and supernatural heredity and genetics fairies sorcerers witches and werewolves are viewed from the perspectives of popular nightmare tales depictions of race and ethnicity popular public discourse and cinematic imagery discussions of the undead and still dead include images of death messengers and draugar zombies and vampires in literature popular media and japanese anime

ghost android animal challenges the notion that trauma literature functions as a healing agent for victims of severe pain and loss by bringing trauma studies into the orbit of posthumanist thought investigating how literary representations of ghosts androids and animals engage traumatic experience this book revisits canonical texts by william faulkner and toni morrison and aligns them with experimental and popular texts by shirley jackson philip k dick and clive barker in establishing this textual field the book reveals how depictions of non human agents invite readers to cross subjective and cultural thresholds and interact with the impossible pain of others ultimately this study asks us to consider new practices for reading trauma literature that enlarges our conceptions of the human and the real

the evolution of horror in the twenty first century examines the intimate connections between the horror genre and its audience s experience of being in the world at a particular historical and cultural moment this book not only provides frameworks with which to understand contemporary horror but it also speaks to the changes wrought by technological development in creation production and distribution as well as the ways in which those who are traditionally underrepresented positively within the genre women lgbtq indigenous and bame communities are finally being seen and finding space to speak

netflix s the haunting of hill house has received both critical acclaim and heaps of contempt for its reimagining of shirley jackson s seminal horror novel some found mike flanagan s series inventive respectful and terrifying others believed it denigrated and diminished its source material with some even calling it a betrayal of jackson though the novel has produced a great deal of scholarship this is the first critical collection to look at the television series featuring all new essays from noted scholars and award winning horror authors this collection goes beyond comparing the novel and the netflix adaptation to look at the series through the lenses of gender architecture education hauntology addiction and trauma studies including analysis of the show in the context of 9 11 and me too specific essays compare the series with other texts from flanagan s other films and other adaptations of jackson s novel to the television series supernatural toni morrison s

beloved and the 2018 film *Hereditary* together this collection probes a terrifying television series about how scary reality can truly be usually because of what it says about our lives in America today

throughout time there have been stories of witches ghosts and things that go bump in the night there have been famous cases of poltergeists hauntings ghosts and possessions but no story is as hair raising or spine chilling as a story that is horrifyingly true a difficult and evil tragedy that can happen to anyone such as a friend someone you know a family member or even to you this is a true story that happened to a well liked and professional family it began in 1972 and continued until well let's just say that this is a two part novel the names of the family members and the people involved have been changed to protect their reputation and their identities it has taken forty two years to tell about the O'Brien's frightening ordeal now for the first time ever this is their story

a family through their wartime endeavours perfect for fans of pam evans and harry bowling living in their two up two down in rotherhithe in 1938 eileen and ronald wells lead a happy and settled existence with their three daughters all of whom have jobs boyfriends and promising lives ahead of them but soon the storm clouds of war engulf europe and they suddenly find their idyllic family life thrown into chaos throughout the country young people hasten to join up and eileen watches anxiously as her two older girls do the same one in the air force and one in the land army while the youngest goes into a factory with her family scattered and the war getting worse by the day eileen throws herself into the community always on hand to help friends and neighbours when tragedy strikes while savouring any rare moments of celebration what readers are saying about love and war dee williams stories are so brilliant there is at least one page in every book that reduces me to tears i am so drawn into the story i absolutely loved this book from the moment i opened the cover i knew it would be a fab read story was great characters were lovely and it took me back into a previous era cried buckets towards the end i would recommend this book to anyone who enjoys books set in the war about a great friendship and hard times this is one of the best books i have ever read it s brilliant with a great unexpected ending
