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in living chinese philosophy roger t ames uses comparative cultural hermeneutics as a method for contrasting classical greek ontology the science of being in itself with classical chinese zoetology the art of living which is made explicit in the yijing ䷀ or book of changes parmenides plato and aristotle give us a substance ontology grounded in being qua being or being per se to on he on that guarantees a permanent and unchanging subject as the substratum for the human experience this substratum or essence includes its purpose for being telos and defines the what it means to be a thing of this kind eidos of any particular thing thus setting a closed exclusive boundary and the strict identity necessary for a particular thing to be this and not that in the book of changes we find a vocabulary that makes explicit cosmological assumptions that are a stark alternative to this substance ontology it also provides the interpretive context for the canonical texts by locating them within a holistic organic and ecological worldview to provide a meaningful contrast with this fundamental assumption of on or being we might borrow the greek notion of zoe or life and create the neologism zoe tology as the art of living shengshenglun ䷀ this cosmology begins from living sheng ䷀ itself as the motive force behind change and gives us a world of boundless becomings not things that are but events that are happening a contrast between an ontological conception of human beings and a process conception of what the author calls human becomings

the author was in utah from 1882 1890 as a member of the utah commission

for about two decades say johnson and pace the discussion of how to address prose style in teaching college writing has been stuck with style standing in as a proxy for other stakes in the theory wars the traditional argument is evidently still quite persuasive to some that teaching style is mostly a matter of teaching generic conventions through repetition and practice such a position usually presumes the traditional view of composition as essentially a service course one without

content of its own on the other side the shortcomings of this argument have been much discussed that it neglects invention revision context meaning even truth that it is not congruent with research that it ignores 100 years of scholarship establishing composition s intellectual territory beyond service the discussion is stuck there and all sides have been giving it a rest in recent scholarship yet style remains of vital practical interest to the field because everyone has to teach it one way or another a consequence of the impasse is that a theory of style itself has not been well articulated johnson and pace suggest that moving the field toward a better consensus will require establishing style as a clearer subject of inquiry accordingly this collection takes up a comprehensive study of the subject part i explores the recent history of composition studies the ways it has figured and all but effaced the whole question of prose style part ii takes to heart elbow s suggestion that composition and literature particularly as conceptualized in the context of creative writing courses have something to learn from each other part iii sketches practical classroom procedures for heightening students abilities to engage style and part iv explores new theoretical frameworks for defining this vital and much neglected territory the hope of the essays here focusing as they do on historical aesthetic practical and theoretical issues is to awaken composition studies to the possibilities of style and in turn to rejuvenate a great many classrooms

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
