a novel based on the life of the author s great grandmother follows the story of vyry the child of a white plantation owner and one of his slaves through the years of the civil war and reconstruction

three contemporary novels of slavery margaret walker s jubilee 1966 sherley anne williams s dessa rose 1986 and toni morrison s beloved 1987 are the central focus of liberating narratives in significantly different ways that reflect their individual and socio political contexts of origin these three novels can all be read as critiques of historical representation and as alternative spaces for remembrance sites of memory that attempt to shift the conceptual ground on which our knowledge of the past is based

nation's richest literary legacy why mississippi what does it mean to write in a state of such extremes to write of racial and economic relations so contradictory and fraught as to defy any logic willie morris often quoted william faulkner as saying to understand the world you must first understand a place like mississippi what faulkner or more likely morris posits is that mississippi is not separate from the world the country's fascination with mississippi persists because the place embodies the very conflicts that plague the nation this volume examines indigenous literature southwest humor slave narratives and the literature of the civil war essays on modern and contemporary writers and the state's changing role in southern studies look at more recent literary trends while essays on key individual authors offer more information on luminaries including faulkner eudora welty richard wright tennessee williams and margaret walker finally essays on autobiography poetry drama and history span the creative breadth of mississippi's literature written by literary scholars closely connected to the state the volume offers a history suitable for all readers interested in learning more about mississippi's great literary tradition

in depictions of home in african american literature trudier harris analyzes fictional homespaces in african american literature from those set in the time of slavery to modern urban configurations of the homespace she argues that african american writers often inadvertently create and follow a tradition of portraying dysfunctional and physically or emotionally violent homespaces harris explores the roles race and religion play in the creation of homespaces and how geography space and character all influence these spaces although many characters in african american literature crave safe happy homespaces and frequently carry such images with them through their mental or physical migrations few characters experience the formation of healthy homespaces by the end of their journeys harris studies the historical cultural and literary portrayals of the home in works from well known authors such as richard wright james baldwin toni morrison and august wilson as well as lesser studied authors such as daniel black a j verdelle margaret walker and dorothy west

women have had a complex experience in african american culture the first work of its kind this encyclopedia approaches african american literature from a women's studies perspective while yolanda williams page's encyclopedia of african american women writers provides biographical entries on more than 150 literary figures this book is much broader in scope included are several hundred alphabetically arranged entries on african american women writers as well as on male writers who have treated women in their works entries on genres periods themes characters historical events texts places and other topics are included as well each entry is written by an expert contributor and relates its subject to the overall experience of women in african american literature entries cite works for further reading and the encyclopedia closes with a selected general bibliography african american culture is enormously diverse and the experience of women in african american society is especially complex women were among the first african american writers and works by black women writers are popular among students and general readers alike at the same time african american women have been oppressed and texts by black male authors represent women in a variety of ways the first of its kind this encyclopedia approaches african american literature from a women's studies perspective and thus significantly illuminates the african american cultural experience through literary works included are several hundred alphabetically arranged entries written by numerous expert contributors in addition to covering male and female african american authors the encyclopedia also discusses themes major works and characters genres periods historical events places and other topics included are entries on such authors as maya angelou james baldwin frederick douglass nikki giovanni june jordan claude mckay ishmael reed sojourner truth phillis wheatley and many others in addition the many works discussed include beloved blanche on the lam i know why the caged bird sings the men of brewster place quicksand the street waiting to exhale and many more the many topical entries cover black feminism black nationalism conjuring children's and young adult literature detective fiction epistolary novel motherhood sexuality spirituality stereotypes and many others entries relate their topics to the experience of african american women and cite works for further reading features and benefits includes hundreds of alphabetically arranged entries draws on the work of numerous expert contributors includes a selected general bibliography offers a range of finding aids such as a list of entries a guide to related topics and an extensive index supports the literature curriculum by helping students analyze major writers and works supports the social

seminar paper from the year 2007 in the subject english language and literature studies literature grade 1 5 university of cologne course einführungsseminar literaturwissenschaft teil b the neo slave narrative language english abstract on nearly 500 pages margaret walker tells the story of her great grandmother jubilee is the story about vyry a black female slave who longs for freedom and finally gains it at least officially after the civil war years besides this individual destiny the novel contains historical sections and information about political developments during that time several complex characters in addition to vyry and inside views even of white characters detailed descriptions of the slaves everyday life their family structures their language and their hierarchies my term paper will deal with those elements which turn jubilee into a folk novel i e an account of african american traditions which were passed from generation to generation orally it was clear to me that walker had intended to write a kind of folk novel when i read her dedication she dedicated her first and only novel to her family especially to her four children so that they may know something of their heritage apparently family boundaries and traditions do not only play a major role in the novel but also did in walker s own life after reading walker s essay how i wrote jubilee there was further evidence found for my initial intuition there she mentions i always intended jubilee to be a folk novel based on folk material folk sayings folk belief folkways walker 1973 62 furthermore the origin of jubilee is a piece of oral tradition itself according to the same essay her grandmother had told her stories about slave life in georgia ever since she was a child walker 1973 51 as an adult she carried out a long lasting research because she was determined to authenticate the story i had heard from my grandmother s lips walker 1973 56 the task of this term paper will be to find instances where its characteristics as a folk novel become obvious to fulfil this task i will begin with a summary of the novel and i will provide a working definition of the term folklore afterwards there will be a closer investigation of some folkloric categories which are represented in jubilee

representing an international gathering of scholars fields watered with blood constitutes the first critical assessment of the full scope of margaret walker s literary career as they discuss walker s work including the landmark poetry collection for my

when twenty seven year old margaret walker s first collection of poems for my people won the yale poets award in 1942 she was just beginning her long and distinguished career as a poet novelist biographer and teacher when her novel jubilee was published to great acclaim in 1966 the new york review of books said it chronicles the triumph of a free spirit over many kinds of bondages jubilee is noteworthy for being one of the first novels to present african american history from both a black and female perspective it is a historical and fictional account of walker s great grandmother s life from slavery through reconstruction as told to walker by her maternal grandmother in trumpeting a fiery sound jacqueline miller carmichael examines the novel s genesis and composition the process of revision and publication the work s structure and narrative strategies its use of history and folklore and its critical reception in the three decades since its first publication

selected stories poems and plays trace the development of black american literature since colonial times
