each nursing model incorporates specific views on four value laden components nursing person health environment in part two of the study an action research approach was used to implement the human needs model hnm on a long stay psychiatry ward within a broader quasi experimental design selected quality of care indicators were appraised before and after the implementation of the model these dependent variables were also monitored on a control ward data were collected on both wards at one pretest and two posttest points using a triangulation of mostly quantitative research methods the research instruments delphi technique used emanated from the literature and the field work lasted nearly nine months
