academic mobility in higher education is an old phenomenon but it has become a high profile issue as the numbers of students and staff engaged and the number of countries involved has increased hugely in the last few decades for this reason and many others political cultural and educational this book reports research on the many facets of the experience and people involved both now and in the past the emphasis in research has so far tended to focus on contemporary student mobility but this collection deliberately includes articles on mobile staff because the question of mobility is a matter for universities and higher education in its entirety and not just a matter of bringing new students into existing and unchanging lectures laboratories and seminars despite the fact that universities are and have been international institutions in their composition from the beginning universities became in the 19th and 20th century de facto national institutions this has changed and continues to change in the 21st century for many reasons but often financial as universities seek to enhance their budgets in a globalised

economy and students seek to enhance their employment chances by acquiring qualifications with a difference however even if the starting point is financial nonetheless the chapters in this book demonstrate that the effects of mobility are much more far reaching the effects are on host universities on the university community of staff and students on the ways in which staff and students understand the nature of university study on the ways students may or may not integrate with a local community by experiencing something different for institutions an influx of students with different ideas about academic study for students an interaction with locals and with other internationals for staff a challenge to their assumptions about teaching and learning all see themselves in a new light and are often forced to change this book charts the changes which are happening now and will undoubtedly continue for the foreseeable future it therefore offers all involved a reflection on their own experience and practice and the means of improving them

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this engrossing book demonstrates that the cradle james barr of biblical criticism really lay in the english speaking world and that subsequent problems actually began in england in the period between the reformation and the enlightenment during this time attempts were still being made on a regular basis to reconcile the content of the bible with the questioning of it which was evolving as the result of new scientific discoveries and the development of new moral criteria in this interdisciplinary study professor reventlow leads the reader into the total context of the life and thought in which new ideas about the bible came to birth beginning with the insights of early humanism and the spiritualist movements of the reformation and moving through the puritans to a climax with the deists reventlow traces the fascinating and complex history of biblical criticism always emphasizing the close connection between theology philosophical systems and church politics he illuminates the significance of the intellectual and constitutional development in england for the modern understanding of the bible and conversely he highlights the role of the bible in that development the importance of this book is threefold it is historical it gives us insight into the way biblical understanding is achieved and it helps us understand how we ourselves work and think james barr if we are to answer the theological questions of our time it is reventlow s contention that the reply must pioneer its way out of its past for only a careful survey of the way we have come so far can clarify existing intrinsic presuppositions and help us to overcome them by making us aware of them from back cover

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this book is about the degree to which people take pleasure in life in short happiness it tries to identify conditions that favor a positive appreciation of life thus it hopes to shed more light on a longstanding and intriguing question and possibly to guide attempts to improve the human lot during the preceding decades a growing number of investigations have dealt with this issue as a result there is now a sizable body of data yet it is quite difficult to make sense of it there is a muddle of theories concepts and indicators and many of the findings seem to be contradictory this book attempts to bring some order into the field the study draws on an inventory of empirical investigations which involved valid indicators of happiness 245 studies are involved which together yield some 4000 observations for the main part correlational ones these results are presented in full detail in the simultaneously published databook of happiness veenoven 1984 the present volume distils conclusions from that wealth of data it tries to assess the reality value of the findings and the degree to which correlations reflect the conditions of happiness rather than the consequences of it it then attempts to place the scattered findings in context as such this work is not a typical study of literature on happiness

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
