correspondence documenting a jewish family s personal history of the holocaust and world war ii raya schapiro and helga weinberg found a box of letters among their mother s effects after her death in 1990 they were written by their grandmother and uncle trapped in prague after the nazi occupation to the girls parents who had escaped to the

united states in may 1939 leaving behind raya and helga who were five and seven years old at the time the seventy seven letters reprinted here span a period of two years during which the nazis drew an ever tightening noose of destruction around the jews of prague each letter is followed by notes of explanation and amplification as well as notes on nazi laws and official restrictions and the progress of the war each letter has a censor s stamp on it each envelope bears the still frightening emblem of the third reich the letters dramatically convey the tension growing daily of existence under the nazis and their tone becomes increasingly desperate as every avenue of escape reaches a dead end praise for letters from prague 1939 1941 this book turns an abstraction into a palpable terror and pity chicago tribune a compelling and personal insight into the horrors of the holocaust booklist as it turned out the girls escaped only after months of bureaucratic wrangling while the grandmother and uncle never obtained permission to leave and were deported to the gas chambers at treblinka and auschwitz two years later collected here is the moving correspondence between the adults in prague and the girls parents in the u s publishers weekly

this history of a single town in bohemia casts new light on nationalism in central europe between the springtime of nations in 1848 and the cold war jeremy king tells the story of both german and czech speaking budweis budějovice which belonged to the habsburg monarchy until 1918 and then to czechoslovakia hitler s third reich and czechoslovakia again residents at first simply budweisers or habsburg subjects with mostly local loyalties gradually became czechs or germans who became czech though and who german what did it mean to be one or the other in answering these questions king shows how an epochal region wide contest for power found expression in budweis budějovice not only through elections but through clubs schools boycotts breweries a remarkable constitutional experiment a couple of riots and much more in tracing the nationalization of politics from small and sometimes comic beginnings to the genocide and mass expulsions of the 1940s he also rejects traditional interpretive frameworks writing not a national history but a history of nationhood both czech and german king recovers a nonnational dimension to the past embodied locally by budweisers and more generally by the habsburg state that dimension has long been blocked from view by a national rhetoric of race and ethnicity king s czech habsburg german narrative in addition to capturing the dynamism and complexity of bohemian politics participates in broader scholarly discussions concerning the nature of nationalism

a gripping history that plumbs the extraordinary stories of american relief and rescue workers during world war ii long before their country officially joined the war american aid workers were active in rescue efforts across europe two such americans were martha and waitstill sharp who were originally sent to prague as part of a relief effort but turned immediately to helping jews and dissidents after the 1939 invasion by germany they were not the only ones renowned historian debórah dwork follows the story of rescue workers in five major cities as the refugee crisis expanded to vilna shanghai marseille and lisbon followed by nazi agents spiriting people across borders they learned secrecy others negotiated with government representatives like laura margolis who worked with the japanese to get enough food and warm shelter for the refugees in shanghai yet the women also often faced lack of support from their agencies if part of a couple they fought to get paid even at a low salary despite working as long and hard as their husbands moving and revelatory saints and liars illuminates the unpredictable circumstances and often fast

changing historical events with which these aid workers contended while revealing the moral questions they encountered and the devastating decisions they had to make drawing on a multitude of archival documents from letters to diaries and memos dwork offers us a rare glimpse into the lives of individuals who at times with their organizations backing but sometimes against their directives sought to help people find safe haven from persecution

in march 1939 german troops entered prague the first foreign capital to be occupied by the nazis six years later in may 1945 it was the last to be liberated as hitler s reich collapsed in defeat the nazi occupation had a profound effect and paved the way for the communist dictatorship that followed after the war the entire period was deliberately distorted for political purposes the facts were misrepresented or suppressed publications and documentary films were censored witnesses were silenced the aim of this book is to restore part of the lost history of the occupation after decades of communist manipulation it provides a rare glimpse of life in prague under the german occupation from unique photographs many of them published here for the first time it also reproduces items from ration coupons and identity cards to nazi proclamations and execution lists which were part of everyday life during the german protectorate the result is an objective account of the golden city in the years when prague and its people lived in the shadow of the swastika book jacket

fascinating character and four of them willing to drop whatever they were doing in their lives to come to the aid of those in danger
