and thoroughly in the mid nineteenth century about 60 000 inhabitants mostly poor peasants set out to gain independence from denmark which was finally achieved in 1944 with the foundation of a republic in recent decades iceland has caught up economically with its closest neighbours this has come about mainly through the mechanisation of fishing which gave rise to a second battle for sovereignty this time over the country s fishing grounds
