ideology found in children's literature furthermore the focus of this book is multivalent and interconnecting while historically tracing a few texts from around the world along a timeline this book also seeks to convey the transformative and intertextual nature of these respective texts thereby revealing that children's literature is not an isolated genre but instead one that conveys and is subject to all the same ideologies as other genres of literature furthermore it is important to note that these chapters highlight texts from around the world as the title expresses therefore the reader can see how audiences have responded to and transformed texts pertaining to such countries as india the united states and the united kingdom as well as regions like western europe and scandinavia meta narratively speaking this book also reflects the multinational nature and audience of this book with contributing scholars writing from and representing various parts of the world most importantly the thread that ties all of these topics together is transformation
