how black american women have uplifted black communities and critiqued dominant white memories in community and critique sara c vanderhaagen analyzes black women s memory work a deliberate public effort to create preserve revise and circulate accounts of the past to strengthen community bonds and effect change vanderhaagen draws from the resources of rhetorical studies public memory studies and black feminism to examine key examples of black women s memory work during the critical historical period between reconstruction and the harlem renaissance these instances include public addresses about exemplary women speeches given at the 1893 world s congress of representative women the 1923 campaign against the black mammy monument that was proposed for creation in washington dc and the 1926 biography collection homespun heroines and other women of distinction responding to a call by black feminist scholars to move beyond recovery toward deeper engagement with black women s intellectual and rhetorical work community and critique centers the memory work of black american women to demonstrate the significant if underexamined role that they played in shaping our shared past

winner of the 2015 lgbt studies award presented by the lambda literary foundation unearths connections between homoeroticism cannibalism and cultures of consumption in the context of american literature and us slave culture that has largely been ignored until now scholars of us and transatlantic slavery have largely ignored or dismissed accusations that black americans were cannibalized vincent woodard takes the enslaved person s claims of human consumption seriously focusing on both the literal starvation of the slave and the tropes of cannibalism on the part of the slaveholder and further draws attention to the ways in which blacks experienced their consumption as a fundamentally homoerotic occurrence the delectable negro explores these connections between homoeroticism cannibalism and cultures of consumption in the context of american literature and us slave culture utilizing many staples of african american literature and culture such as the slave narratives of olaudah equiano harriet jacobson and frederick douglass as well as other less circulated materials like james l smith s slave narrative runaway slave advertisements and numerous articles from black newspapers published in the nineteenth century woodard traces the racial assumptions political aspirations gender codes and philosophical frameworks that dictated both european and white american arousal towards black males and hunger for black male flesh woodard uses these texts to unpack how slaves struggled not only against social consumption but also against endemic mechanisms of starvation and hunger designed to break them he concludes with an examination of the controversial chain gang oral sex scene in toni morrison s beloved suggesting that even at the end of the twentieth and beginning of the twenty first century we are still at a loss for language with which to describe black male hunger within a plantation culture of consumption

at the same time that the civil rights movement brought increasing opportunities for blacks the united states liberalized its immigration policy while the broadening of the united states s borders to non european immigrants fits with a black political agenda of social justice recent waves of immigration have presented a dilemma for blacks

prompting ambivalent or even negative attitudes toward migrants what has an expanded immigration regime meant for how blacks express national attachment in this book niambi michele carter argues that immigration both historically and in the contemporary moment has served as a reminder of the limited inclusion of african americans in the body politic as carter contends blacks use the issue of immigration as a way to understand the nature and meaning of their american citizenship specifically the way that white supremacy structures and constrains not just their place in the american political landscape but their political opinions as well white supremacy gaslights black people and others into critiquing themselves and each other instead of white supremacy itself but what may appear to be a conflict between blacks and other minorities is about self preservation carter draws on original interview material and empirical data on african american political opinion to offer the first theory of black public opinion toward immigration
