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this user friendly guide by a noted biblical scholar explores three crucial questions that often pose difficulty for those seeking to understand the doctrine of the trinity

this title offers a comprehensive analysis of baptist theology embracing in one common trajectory the major baptist confessions of faith the major baptist theologians and the principal baptist theological movements and controversies this book spans four centuries of baptist doctrinal history acknowledging first the pre 1609 roots patristic medieval and reformational of baptist theology it examines the arminian versus calvinist issues that were first expressed by the general baptists and the particular baptists that dominated english and american baptist theology during the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries from helwys and smyth and from bunyan and kiffin to gill fuller backus and boyce and that were quickened by the awakenings and the missionary movement concurrently there were the baptist defense of the baptist distinctives vis a vis the pedobaptist world and the unfolding of a strong baptist confessional tradition then during the nineteenth and twentieth centuries the liberal versus evangelical issues became dominant with hovey strong rauschenbusch and henry in the north and mullins conner hobbs and criswell in the south even as a distinctive baptist landmarkism developed the discipline of biblical theology was practiced and a structured ecumenism was pursued missiology both impacted baptist theology and took it to all the continents where it became increasingly indigenous conscious that baptists belong to the free churches and to the believers churches a new generation of baptist theologians at the advent of the twenty first century appears somewhat more calvinist than arminian and decidedly more evangelical than liberal

a noted biblical scholar explores three questions christians often ask about the old testament and provides answers that are both satisfying and understandable

the thesis of this book is that virtue ethics is key to understanding trinitarian progressive sanctification the thesis is supported by four reasons why virtue ethics is key to understanding trinitarian progressive sanctification 1 the trinity virtue ethics and sanctification are historically and conceptually interconnected in the tradition and

scripture 2 virtue ethics based on metaphysical realism is the most biblically consistent ethical framework for trinitarian progressive sanctification 3 jesus active roles as a teacher and example of virtue play an important part in trinitarian sanctification and 4 jesus priestly heavenly intercession aimed at manifesting virtue in believers is crucial to understanding how the trinity progressively sanctifies believers the active roles of jesus in sanctification ordered by the triune premise indicate that the trinity sanctifies such that 1 the value having its source from the father is revealed through the teaching of the son to motivate believers who are empowered to be motivated by the spirit 2 the character that is from the father is revealed through the son's example that is to be imitated by the believer through habituation and reciprocity by the spirit's leading and 3 believers are led by the spirit's intercession into prayer rom 8 14 16 26 27 to be helped through the son's priestly intercession in order to receive an answer from the father with the aim of manifesting the virtues of endurance and hope in the lives of believers

this work is a collection of twenty five papers that i have personally written they consist of themes which were actually suggested assigned and moderated by seasoned professors and biblical scholars in various aspects of biblical theology although in some cases i have modified the themes yet i tried as much as possible to remain focused on the objectives of the papers one very interesting point to note is the treatment of most of these themes basically from the biblical perspective this is mostly with regards to themes drawn from courses which are not strictly scriptural courses but rather are more of theological courses which nonetheless form an integral part of the study of biblical theology so in addition to the core scriptural courses i have featured themes from fundamental theology ecclesiology and eschatology sacramental and liturgical theology trinitarian theology etcetera also it suffices to note that this work is not a commentary on the bible nor is it a comprehensive approach to all the courses in biblical theology rather it is a treatment of some important provocative and challenging themes scholars or students encounter in the course of their study of biblical theology this is simply meant to give one an idea of how these themes together shape biblical theology and most importantly how to approach some of these themes i hope you will find them very helpful and interesting

we cannot relate to a spirit god a spirit savior a spirit uncle and a spirit enemy without embracing the spirit world this book coined the phrase earth life bias elb to identify the enemy s work in our daily lives and illustrate how most believers just add our abba father as an accessory to this life instead of becoming citizens of heaven and members of his family this book illustrates how pervasive elb is in every aspect of our lives without criticizing any person organization or denomination they all serve our abba father s purpose and all have romans 10 in their holy bibles which shows us how to avoid the fiery pit the rest of the scripture is about our relationships esoteric knowledge of the scripture is for scholars we need to apply it to our lives after revealing the elb in our lives we explain how to escape it by embracing the supernatural divine spirit world and how the godly control system the heart mind spirit soul connection with the holy spirit jesus and our abba father works with that foundation we show how build our faith relationships and marriages converting for better or worse to sanctified marriage with vows to our abba father to do it his way there is also a section on daniel which brings our abba father into modern times explains what is taking jesus so long to get here and answers a lot of questions about end times this section is work but it is a giant faith builder as you will see but regardless of where we worship we are individually responsible for own relationship with our abba father and this book will help any believer grow their faith and experience the full joy peace and glory our abba father created for us

a grammar of holy mystery is about christian spirituality it is about mysticism as a firsthand encounter with the presence of god unfathomable unnamable mysterious fulfilling it is about classical christianity the way of transforming truth found in christ taught in scripture lived by saints sages and mystics and passed on as a sacred trust through the centuries being neither liberal nor conservative but simply christian it is ecumenical in spirit for those traumatized by harsh or shallow churches a grammar of holy mystery points the way out and shows the way to a faith that renews the mind restores the spirit and gladdens the heart

many scholars believe that friedrich schleiermacher relegating the doctrine of the trinity to an appendix at the end of his magnum opus *The Christian Faith* 1830 31 his alleged disregard for the trinity is the supposed death knell for serious consideration of his work within the history of christian thought this volume argues that schleiermacher not only calls for the doctrine's revitalization but also makes it the centrepiece of protestant christianity following schleiermacher's own thought experiment poe presents his doctrine of god in reverse order of its original presentation her examination centres on the trinity treating it as the keystone of the entire work while analysing the divine attributes love and wisdom justice and holiness eternity omniscience omnipotence and omnipresence when viewed from the standpoint of the conclusion the trinitarian shape of schleiermacher's theology comes to the fore what emerges is a middle way between merely economic trinitarianism and a full fledged development of immanent trinitarianism examining divine personhood and the union of the divine with humanity the central thesis of this work runs boldly counter to the prevailing academic account of schleiermacher's doctrine of the trinity and offers an innovative and constructive reading readers will be privy to a fresh look at schleiermacher's doctrine of god and its importance for contemporary theology

in 1967 karl rahner famously wrote the economic trinity is the immanent trinity and vice versa from that time onwards rahner's rule has become the norm for conceiving the relationship between the trinity in the economy of salvation and god's eternal inner life evangelical theologians currently employ rahner's rule in a variety of ways one of the most popular is the strict realist reading whereby trinitarian relationships in salvation history are taken to mirror eternal relationships within god this book brings this norm into conversation with the witness of scripture in order to assess its viability in doing so it highlights troubling issues that arise from the application of the strict realist reading of rahner's rule to the narrative of luke acts this book suggests that the strict realist reading can be shown to be a questionable basis for our doctrine of god's inner life
