business ethics as a discipline leans on cases but flourishes by thorough analysis and reflection the present volume offers both after three introductory chapters into business ethics eight recent european cases mainly stemming from the netherlands and belgium and all of them with a clear moral impact are extensively described and analysed among them are the lernout and hauspie speech technology disaster heineken s struggle with the promotion girls selling beer in cambodia cartels in the dutch construction industry the pharmaceutical industry and the aids crisis and unilever allegedly making use of child labour in the cotton industry in india each case is followed by two expert comments from the fields of general ethics but also of law economics management and organisation theory sociology and social psychology cases and comments together offer an unique entrance in varieties of moral reasoning and in the personal and institutional dimensions to be taken into account when facing a corporate case saturated with moral ambiguities this book will be of interest to researchers as well as teachers of undergraduate and graduate courses in business ethics business in society management and organisation theory and strategic management it will also be useful for business practitioners eager to find moral guidance in their specific field

this book provides a basis for class discussion about the responsible conduct of social science research these 16 brief research ethics cases describe situations in which ethical dilemmas arise and present the student with the opportunity to think through the different implications for researchers the cases emphasize different types of ethical dilemmas involving faculty students participants and stakeholders students can discuss what happened why it was or was not unethical and what should be the consequences for the actors included are the original cases complete with learning objectives teaching notes and questions for discussion

this book teaches students how to make the difficult ethical decisions that journalists routinely face by taking a case based approach the authors argue that the best way to make an ethical decision is to look closely at a particular situation rather than looking first to an abstract set of ethical theories or principles this book goes beyond the traditional approaches of many other journalism textbooks by using cases as the starting point for building ethical practices casuistry the technical name of such a method develops provisional guidelines from the bottom up by reasoning analogically from an easy ethical case the paradigm to harder ethical cases thoroughly grounded in actual experience this method admits more nuanced judgments than most theoretical approaches
