based on detailed notes taken during a doctor s incarceration in the concentration camps and ghettos of romanian ruled transnistria during the holocaust this memoir tells a gripping story of calculated murder resistance and survival in the aftermath of the romanian holocaust transnistria a little known region north of odessa between the dniester and bug rivers came to be known as the forgotten cemetery between 1941 and 1944 an estimated 300 000 jews were killed or died there from starvation and disease this memoir by dr arthur kessler based on daily notes he kept as a physician during his two year imprisonment in transnistria s vapniarka concentration camp and olgopol ghetto provides a unique perspective of a jewish medical doctor who witnessed murderous death as well as brave acts of resistance and survival introduced and annotated by historian leo spitzer and translated from german by the late margaret robinson dr kessler s memoir provides an engrossing account of his infamous discovery that vapniarka s romanian authorities routinely and it seems knowingly fed camp inmates a daily soup containing toxic chickling peas lathyrus sativus that induced paralysis kidney failure and oftentimes death it reveals the daring by which he together with fellow inmate medical associates saved hundreds of lives by organizing a hunger strike that resulted in the camp s dissolution and the prisoners relocation to ghettos throughout transnistria kessler s narrative continues with an account of privileges attainable by deportees with useful skills and provides illuminating details about informal systems and practices that enabled many to survive and to provide care to fellow victims of genocidal persecution the memoir is illustrated with moving drawings produced by prisoners in the vapniarka concentration camp and presented to dr kessler in recognition of his brave work of healing

pseudo memoirs redefines the notion of fiction itself a form that has all too often been understood in terms of its capacity to produce a seeming reality rochelle tobias argues that

the verisimilitude of the novel derives not from its object but from the subjectivity at its base what generates the plausibility of fiction is not the referentiality of its depictions but the intentionality of consciousness edmund husserl developed the idea that consciousness is always intentional in the sense that it is directed outside itself toward something that it does not find so much as it constitutes as an object pseudo memoirs reveal the full implications of this position in their double structure as the tale of their own telling or the fiction of life writing in so doing they reveal how the world of fiction is constructed but more important they bring to the fore the idealist premises that fuel the novel and guarantee its truth even when it remains an invention of the imagination rochelle tobias explores novels by thomas mann robert walser thomas bernhard and w g sebald in conjunction with philosophical and theoretical texts by rené descartes husserl friedrich nietzsche györgy Łukács roland barthes and maurice blanchot

a matter of duty needs to be required reading for all saf officers and mindef professional staff it is a lively candid engaging and at times surprising memoir that explains how the formative years were used to turn bits and pieces into a comprehensive and organised armed forces that are now a core institution of the country in an astonishingly short time the array of different challenges and problems that had to be overcome to give singapore the robust deterrent it now has will inform all readers and surprise many and no stone is left unturned herein one hopes that the current and future generations of their successors tackle their duty with the same resolve displayed by tan chin tiong and the mentor who called his generation to duty the father of the saf dr goh keng swee brian farrell professor of military history at the history department national university of singapore and author of the defence and fall of singapore many books have been written about goh keng swee but none were about his work in the ministry of defence where he raised the saf almost from scratch starting with only two infantry battalions in 1967 this book breaks the trend as it provides a captivating account of dr goh s monumental work in the saf s early military history as seen through the eyes of tan chin tiong the prototype soldier scholar who answered the call of duty to assist him in the endeavour mr tan highlights in readable prose how numerous singapore and saf institutions policies and practices familiar to our citizens and national servicemen bear the personal and farsighted imprint of dr goh this book is recommended reading for all those who serve in the saf kumar ramakrishna professor and dean of the s rajaratnam school of international studies nanyang technological university author of extremist islam recognition and response in southeast asia the author writes with clarity as well as with authority and candour drawing on his extensive personal involvement he provides fresh insights into many aspects of the development of the singapore armed forces saf between the late 1960s and the early 80s under the ministerial leadership of dr goh keng swee among the many facets that he discusses are the development of the saf command structure the crucial influence of israeli as well as german military advisors on the young saf s organisation doctrine and training the origins of saf armour the early phases of the saf s overseas training arrangements with other countries and the establishment of the singapore civil defence force this book should contribute significantly to understanding how the saf

in a bumpy anxiety producing plane ride across the straits of florida to cuba in 1979 graduate student gerald poyo knew his life would either end that day in the world war ii era prop airplane or change forever he survived the trip and his ten day visit solidified his academic research and confirmed his career as a history professor in this wide ranging examination of his relatives migrations in the western hemisphere the americas over five generations poyo uses his training as a historian to unearth his family s stories beginning with his great great grandfather s flight from cuba to key west in 1869 this is also about the loss of a beloved homeland his father was cuban his mother was from flint michigan poyo himself was six months old when his parents took him to bogotá colombia he celebrated his eighth birthday in new jersey and his tenth in venezuela he was 12 when he landed in buenos aires where he spent his formative years before returning to the united states for college my heart belonged to the south but somehow i knew i could not escape the north he writes transnationalism shaped his life and identity divided into two parts the first section traces his parents and ancestors as he links their stories to impersonal movements in the world spanish colonialism cuban nationalism united states expansionism that influenced their lives the second half explores how exile migration and growing up a hemispheric american a borderless american impacted his own development and stimulated questions about poverty religion and relations between latin america and the united states ultimately this thought provoking memoir unveils the universal desire for a safe stable life for one s family

war ethics theory practice and memoir is an extraordinarily diverse collection of over ninety readings on the ethics law morality and justice of armed conflict each of the foundational theories of war ethics realism pacifism just war theory and international law is examined in

depth as are challenging alternative perspectives from feminist thinkers and the world s major religions a substantial section on contemporary issues covers topics ranging from cyberwar a i terrorism and drones to torture war s environmental impacts and the rights of soldiers and veterans also included is an extensive collection of riveting first person accounts from soldiers civilians and observers which powerfully convey the personal impacts of war introductory discussions and summary articles from brian orend are integrated throughout the text including a closing essay on new technologies and the future of war

journey to ithaca is an extraordinary memoir about an extraordinary life of its author it may well be said in shakespeare s words from henry vi part i aptly quoted in the prelims who would e er suppose he had such courage and audacity from the outset william rowland invites his readers to accompany him along his personal journey to ithaca it was at ithaca mansions in sea point cape town that at the age of five a happy little boy lost his vision in consequence of a gunshot through his temple severing his optic nerves that was definitively the day the light went out with enormous courage and determination william approached life head on achieving what many others might have found too daunting to attempt writing with restraint and dignity in journey to ithaca william tells his life story in a series of short chapters marking significant stages and events of his life recounting the challenges and the achievements in equal measure and often with gentle humour what shines through most strongly from this memoir is that at no time has william allowed his blindness to define or limit him and certainly never to deny him the fullness of experience and adventure encountered by the sighted intellectual leader innovator activist author mentor as well as loving father william rowland fills each of these roles with consummate ability and enthusiasm his life story thus far as told in journey to ithaca will inspire all who read it whether blind or sighted

as the first woman in her indo caribbean family to be an engineer sunita enjoyed her career in canadian tech but soon saw a darker side of corporate life this memoir is a courageous and open first hand account of how work can harm health spirit and integrity you II cheer on the sidelines as sunita finds well being in a silent mindfulness retreat with a group of strangers from toronto after losing her health to toxic stress readers will enjoy how the story flows and leave with techniques to create more balance peace and health even if they are navigating toxic situations

in the summers of the early 1970s morris ardoin and his siblings helped run their family s roadside motel in a hot buggy bayou town in cajun louisiana the stifling sticky heat inspired them to find creative ways to stay cool and out of trouble when they were not doing their chores handling a colorful cast of customers scrubbing motel room toilets plucking chicken bones and used condoms from under the beds they played canasta an old ladies game that provided them with a refuge from the sun and helped them avoid their violent troubled father morris was successful at occupying his time with his siblings and the children of families staying in the motel s kitchenette apartments but was not so successful at keeping clear of

his father a man unable to shake the horrors he had experienced as a child and later as a soldier the preteen would learn as he matured that his father had reserved his most ferocious attacks for him because of an inability to accept a gay or to his mind broken son it became his dad s mission to fix his son and morris s mission to resist and survive intact he was aided in his struggle immeasurably by the love and encouragement of a selfless and generous grandmother who provides his story with much of its warmth wisdom and humor there s also suspense awkward romance naughty french lessons and an insider s take on a truly remarkable not yet homogenized pocket of american culture

in 1992 rahla xenopoulos was diagnosed with bipolar disorder despite the devastating diagnosis she sought education on her affliction although she found an abundance of literature on various mental illnesses none of it seemed applicable to her this situation inspired her to write a book chronicling her ongoing efforts to come to terms with a disease that is in effect a life sentence the book recounts her upbringing in an eccentric loving jewish family her struggle with bulimia anorexia and self mutilation her attempts at suicide finding true love and finally the crazy utterly unpredictable experience of giving birth to triplets this is neither a self help book nor a med ical guide reading this book will not cure anyone bipolar disorder is a chronic illness but it did help rahla as it will countless others to understand the rhythm in the cacophony of this condition

winner of the 2022 mississippi institute of arts and letters award for life writing growing up in the delta town of yazoo city mississippi teresa nicholas believed that she and her country born and bred mother weren t close she knew little of her mother s early life as a sharecropper during the great depression but whenever she brought up the subject her taciturn mother would snap you ask too many questions young un nicholas left mississippi to attend college then settled in new york to work in the hard driving world of commercial book publishing twenty five years later eager for a change she and her husband decided to shift careers to writing trading their home in the new york suburbs for a casita in the mexican highlands but as her mother s health deteriorated nicholas found herself spending more time in the small town she thought she had left behind over long afternoons in front of turner classic movies she grew closer to her mother coaxing stories from her about her hardscrabble past until a major stroke threatened to silence her mother s newfound voice torn between her new home in mexico and her old home in mississippi nicholas struggled to find her place in the world she discovered that the past isn t always the way we remember it and as the years ticked by that she and her mother could grow closer still the mama chronicles a memoir is a funny and poignant account of a mother daughter relationship and ultimately a meditation on acceptance and what it means to call a place home

the story of the creation of jean monnet s memoirs is long complicated and remains incomplete the following account is the product of many years of research and yet is ultimately lacking a full sense of monnet s own view of the enterprise even in this partial account much insight into his thoughts and goals emerges the struggle he endured over the last thirty years of his long life to express the meaning of his work and his life is clearer now

than when the memoires were published in 1976 the credit for this improved understanding belongs to his many friends and supporters who helped bring forth the story of his life introduction

still here memoirs of trauma illness and loss explores the history ethics and cross cultural range of memoirs focusing on illness death loss displacement and other experiences of trauma from walt whitman s civil war diaries to kitchen table survivor to survivor storytelling following hurricane katrina from social media posts from a refugee detention centre to poetry by exiles fleeing war zones the collection investigates trauma memoir writing as healing as documentation of suffering and disability and as political activism editors bunty avieson fiona giles and sue joseph have brought together this scholarly collection as a sequel to their earlier mediating memory routledge 2018 providing a closer look at the specific concerns of trauma memoir including conflict and intergenerational trauma the therapeutic potential and risks of trauma life writing its ethical challenges and trauma memoir giving voice to minority experiences

since the early 1990s tens of thousands of memoirs by celebrities and unknown people have been published sold and read by millions of american readers the memoir boom as the explosion of memoirs on the market has come to be called has been welcomed vilified and dismissed in the popular press but is there really a boom in memoir production in the united states if so what is causing it are memoirs all written by narcissistic hacks for an unthinking public or do they indicate a growing need to understand world events through personal experiences this study seeks to answer these questions by examining memoir as an industrial product like other products something that publishers and booksellers help to create these popular texts become part of mass culture where they are connected to public events the genre of memoir and even genre itself ceases to be an empty classification category and becomes part of social action and consumer culture at the same time from james frey s controversial a million little pieces to memoirs about bartending iran the liberation of dachau computer hacking and the impact of 9 11 this book argues that the memoir boom is more than a publishing trend it is becoming the way american readers try to understand major events in terms of individual experiences the memoir boom is one of the ways that citizenship as a category of belonging between private and public spheres is now articulated

former new york times correspondent john n herbers 1923 2017 who covered the civil rights movement for more than a decade has produced deep south dispatch memoir of a civil rights journalist a compelling story of national and historical significance born in the south during a time of entrenched racial segregation herbers witnessed a succession of landmark civil rights uprisings that rocked the country the world and his own conscience herbers s retrospective is a timely and critical illumination on america s current racial dilemmas and ongoing quest for justice herbers s reporting began in 1951 when he covered the brutal execution of willie mcgee a black man convicted for the rape of a white housewife and the 1955 trial for the murder of emmett till a black teenager killed for allegedly whistling at a

white woman with immediacy and first hand detail herbers describes the assassination of john f kennedy the death of four black girls in the birmingham alabama church bombing extensive travels and interviews with martin luther king jr ku klux klan cross burning rallies and private meetings the freedom summer murders in philadelphia mississippi and marches and riots in st augustine florida and selma alabama that led to passage of national civil rights legislation this account is also a personal journey as herbers witnessed the movement with the conflicted eyes of a man dedicated to his southern heritage but who also rejected the prescribed laws and mores of a prejudiced society his story provides a complex understanding of how the southern status quo in which the white establishment benefited at the expense of african americans was transformed by a national outcry for justice

historian victoria bynum turns now to her own history in this multigenerational american saga spanning from 1840 to 1979 through meticulous historical research personal letters diaries and the unpublished memoir of mary daniel huckenpoehler the author's maternal grandmother bynum examines five generations within the broader context of the nation s history navigating pivotal events such as first wave immigration the civil war the gilded age the great depression two world wars the cold war and beyond child of a mother from waconia minnesota and father from jones county mississippi bynum blends a historian s voice with personal experiences intertwining her grandmother s unpublished memoir and letters with her own role as a diarist and historian she explores class race ethnicity and gender dynamics from the rise of welsh immigrant ancestors in the upper midwest and the gilded age privileges of her grandmother s upbringing to bynum s own tumultuous childhood in the 1950s and early 1960s as she is shuttled between georgia mississippi minnesota florida and california bynum grapples with numerous dangers of being raised in a volatile environment marked by alcohol fueled violence sexual degradation and neglect against the backdrop of racial segregation civil rights movements and the cold war deep roots broken branches traces the author s coming of age journey and the profound influence of her grandmother revealed through the lens and tensions of an air force family deep roots broken branches explores bynum s intellectual curiosity voracious reading habits and turbulent path through early motherhood divorce and higher education in california throughout her grandmother remains a stabilizing force offering inspiration and guidance this book paints a vivid portrait of a southern identity s growth amid personal challenges and broader societal shifts

today fleet street is just a term for the newspaper business but not so long ago it was a real place each paper had its own favourite pubs its own extraordinary characters and its own stock of legendary tales about the triumphs and disasters that had befallen friends and enemies it was the street of dreams the street of adventure the street of disillusion and in the end sadly the street of profits but once upon a time it was a place of magic mike molloy began in fleet street as a messenger boy on the sunday pictorial and subsequently worked as a cartoonist page designer feature writer and features executive eventually he was appointed the thirteenth and youngest editor of the daily mirror a post he held for ten years to his surprise as he had opposed the take over when robert maxwell bought the mirror maxwell made him editor in chief of the group this is molloy s spellbinding and often hilarious account of his years working with some of the giants and pygmies who produced the nation s daily papers along the way he tells of his encounters with politicians prime ministers rock stars american presidents trade union leaders members of the royal family and some of the legendary figures of show business in the final sector of the book he charts his astonishingly surreal five years with robert maxwell whose chaotic reign brought new heights of blundering absurdity to the role of the tyrannical press lord

for thirty four years sister anne brooks a catholic nun and doctor of osteopathy served one of the nation s most impoverished towns and regions tutwiler in tallahatchie county in the mississippi delta in 1983 she reopened the tutwiler clinic which had remained closed for five
