to use the arts to spark new ideas and empower participants in educational research it will allow readers to conduct arts based research in their own projects the book starts with a brief history of the arts in research going on to provide an in depth understanding of the philosophical foundations of arts based research different research designs material preparation ethical considerations data collection analysis and reporting chapters highlight the impact of arts based research how it can be used to facilitate positive changes in educational research practice and policymaking tian suggests avenues for those who want to further develop these methods guiding readers to reflect on their positionality and ethical issues involved in the research process this insightful book is ideal for early career and experienced educational researchers who use qualitative methods in their inquiries it offers a reader friendly guide to methodology for scholars educators as well as undergraduate and postgraduate students

this text introduces readers to definitions and examples of arts based educational research presents tensions and questions in the field and provides exercises for practice it weaves together critical essays about arts based research in the literary visual and performing arts with examples of artistic products of arts based research arts for scholarship sake that illuminate by example each artistic example is accompanied by a scholar's statement that includes reflection on how the work of art relates to the scholar's research interests and practices arts based research in education foundations for practice helps the reader understand what arts based research is tracing the history of the field and providing examples includes end of chapter questions to engage students in practicing arts based inquiry and to generate class discussion about the material features a diverse range of contributors very established scholars in educational and social science research as well those new to the field represents a variety of voices scholars of color queer and straight orientations different ages experience and nationalities and presents beautiful illustrations of visual art data based poems plays short stories and musical scores first of its kind this volume is intended as a text for arts based inquiry qualitative research methods in education and related courses and as a resource for faculty doctoral students and scholars across the field of social science research methods

activist purposes and is differentiated by its ties to critical pedagogy and related research methodologies

this book considers the practical challenges likely to be faced when conducting research in the reality of busy educational contexts it presents an understanding of the perceived efficacy and accessibility of creative research approaches from the perspective of participants as well as the researcher the book addresses key concerns in research that seeks to understand children's experiences in terms of creativity in thinking methods and analysis the school setting as a socially constructed environment and power relations in experience and data production written in an accessible style that provides a representation of the evolution of arts based research methods it includes illustrative case studies practical suggestions and guidance on further reading this book will assist higher education researchers seeking to represent subjective experience and empower participants in the creative research process this book will be vital reading for researchers completing projects within primary and secondary school settings as well as those involved in teaching and studying at postgraduate level within ma education programmes it will also be of interest to students of research methods at undergraduate level

disciplines are fruitfully using to reveal information and represent experiences that traditional methods cannot capture each of the six major abr genres in narrative inquiry poetry music performance dance and visual art is covered in chapters that introduce key concepts and tools and present an exemplary research article by a leading abr practitioner patricia leavy discusses the kinds of research questions these innovative approaches can address and offers practical guidance for applying them in all phases of a research project from design and data collection to analysis interpretation representation and evaluation chapters include checklists to guide methodological decision making discussion questions and recommended print and online resources

imagination and arts based practices for integration in research explores the philosophical assumptions defining concepts and methodological issues related to the introduction of intentional imaginative mental processes and arts based practices into some or all phases of investigation and data integration of particular research approaches although typically central to mixed multi method and arts based research the practice of integrating diverse forms of data might be applied to other research traditions the integration of data diversity represents a deviation from traditional scientific thinking demanding a dramatic paradigm shift inclusive of multi dimensional nondiscursive aesthetic rhizomatic and imaginative mental processes in this book imaginative mental processes and arts based practices are described and illustrated as approaches to investigating revealing and understanding the elusive yet essential meanings hidden in the crevices shadows and liminal spaces in between diverse data sets leading to integration illumination and synthesis the book will appeal to arts based mixed methods and adventurous researchers it walks the reader through the revisionist philosophical assumptions and offers aligned methodological suggestions to the induction of imaginative mental processes and arts based practices into research

this book examines research using anti oppressive arts based methods to promote social change in oppressed and marginalized communities the contributors discuss literary techniques performance visual art and new media in relation to the co construction of knowledge and positionality reflexivity data representation community building and engagement and pedagogy the contributors to this volume hail from a wide array of disciplines including sociology social work community psychology anthropology performing arts education medicine and public health

this book outlines the principles and practices of arts related inquiry and provides both suggestions about conducting

research in the field as well as case study examples the ideas presented here have emerged from the authors own experiences of undertaking arts related research and the challenges of implementing these approaches the book therefore draws on personal research practice and experience to address the concerns academics increasingly appear to be voicing about developing the scholarship and practice of arts related research there is a need for greater attention to and clarity on issues of theoretical positioning methodology and methods when conducting robust and reputable arts related research which this book provides

the arts based research primer explores the arts based research paradigm and its potential to intersect with and augment traditional social science and educational research methods this text aims to reveal how arts based ways of knowing and doing lend themselves to blended spaces of naturalistic inquiry and is intended to aid artists and scientists alike in their research and professional practices

in company with its sister volume arts based research across textual media in education explores arts based approaches to research across media including film and comics related material from a variety of geographic locations and across a range of subdisciplines within the field of education this first volume takes a textual focus capturing process poetic and dramaturgical approaches the authors aim to highlight some of the approaches that are not always centered in arts based research the contributors represent a variety of arts based practices and methods and they weave this marrying of artistic and scientific expertise and experience into the fabric of the chapters themselves authors from international contexts speak to the importance of utilizing artistic approaches for research processes from multimodal field notes to poetic forms to the dramaturgical chapters in this book represent steps forward in educational inquiry to bringing together both the creative and credible the book includes multiple images and rich descriptions

a provocative book an important book jagodzinski s and wallin s betrayal is in fact a wake up call for art based research a loving critique of its directions jagodzinski s and wallin s reference is the question what art can do not what it means theirs is an ultimate affirmation that uncovers the singularities that compose and give consistency to art not as an object but as an event their betrayal consists in an affirmation of life and becoming positing a performative machinics of the arts which is in absolute contraposition with the hegemonic discourse of art and as an object of knowledge and representation this does not only concern academia but also politics and ethics an untimely book that comes just at the right time bernd herzenrath goethe universität frankfurt am main germany author of an american body politic a deleuzian approach and editor of deleuze ecology and travels in intermedia lity reblurring the boundaries approaching the creative impulse in the arts from the philosophical perspectives of deleuze guattari jagodzinski and wallin make a compelling argument for blurring the boundaries of arts based research in the field of art education the authors contend that the radical ideas of leading scholars in the field are not radical enough due to their reliance on existing research ontologies and those that end in epistemological representations in contrast they propose arts based research as the event of ontological immanence an incipient machinic process of becoming research through arts practice that enables seeing and thinking in irreducible ways while resisting normalization and subsumption under existing modes of address as such arts practice as research in the making constitutes a betrayal of prevailing cultural assumptions according to the authors an interminable renouncement of normalized research representations in favor of the contingent problematic that emerges during arts practice charles garoian professor of art education penn state university author of the prosthetic pedagogy of art jagodzinski and wallin have written a challenging book on the theme of betrayal which aims to question the metaphysical ground of the practice of many arts educators and researchers dismantling the notion of praxis which assumes a prior will as well as the pervasive notion of the creative and reflexive individual they revisit the notion of poiesis and the truth of appearing in order to advocate the centrality of becoming in pedagogical relations is it possible to develop pedagogies beyond those images of thought that attenuate learners teachers and researchers we need a new image of thought or better a thought without image and this book asks us to take up the challenge dennis atkinson director of the centre for the arts and learning department of educational studies

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
