minimalism and fashion is the first book to examine the minimalist movement in fashion while addressing its confluence with and divergence from similar currents in art architecture and design organized by decade the text explores the evolving relationships and influences between fine art and the art of sartorial minimalism and is accompanied by more than 150 breathtaking images this sumptuous volume considers the work of the world s most important designers and artists in fascinating juxtaposition it contains creations by noteworthy designers including madeleine vionnet andré courrÈges halston karl lagerfeld rei kawakubo miuccia prada yohji yamamoto helmut lang and many others there are major works by such key minimalist artists as frank stella sol lewitt donald judd dan flavin rachel whiteread peter halley and jeff koons the volume s photography includes editorial shots by the greatest image makers of this century and the previous including richard avedon hiro francesco scavullo guy bourdin david bailey william klein corinne day and juergen teller the dialogue among fine art photography and fashion is

explored in a brilliantly woven text that clarifies how each form has influenced the other with its extraordinary art and insight this book is a must for lovers of fashion as well as fine art and photography books

the fashion show and its spaces are sites of otherness representing everything from rebellion and excess through to political and social activism this conceptual and stylistic variety is reflected in the spaces they occupy whether they are staged in an industrial warehouse on a city street or out in the open landscape staging fashion is the first collection of essays about the presentation and staging of fashion in runway shows in the period from the 1960s to the 2010s it offers a fresh perspective on the many collaborations between artists architects and interior designers to reinforce their interdisciplinary links fashion architecture and interiors share many elements including design history material culture aesthetics and trends the research and ideas underpinning staging fashion address how fashion and the spatial fields have collaborated in the creation of the space of the fashion show the 15 essays are written by fashion interior architecture and design scholars focusing on the presentation of fashion within the runway space from avant garde practices and collaboration with artists to the most spectacular and commercial shows of recent years from prada to chanel

this unique four volume encyclopedia examines the historical significance of fashion trends revealing the social and cultural connections of clothing from the precolonial times to the present day this sweeping overview of fashion and apparel covers several centuries of american history as seen through the lens of the clothes we wear from the native american moccasin to manolo blahnik s contribution to stiletto heels through four detailed volumes this work delves into what people wore in various periods in our country s past and why from hand crafted family garments in the 1600s to the rough clothing of slaves to the sophisticated textile designs of

the 21st century more than 100 fashion experts and clothing historians pay tribute to the most notable garments accessories and people comprising design and fashion the four volumes contain more than 800 alphabetical entries with each volume representing a different era content includes fascinating information such as that beginning in 1619 through 1654 every man in virginia was required to plant a number of mulberry trees to support the silk industry in england what is known about the clothing of enslaved african americans and that there were regulations placed on clothing design during world war ii the set also includes color inserts that better communicate the visual impact of clothing and fashion across eras

mourning modernism postmodernism illuminates the emergence of a fundamentally new way of thinking and writing about loss in the twentieth century novel one that spurns consolation and the conventional aim of closure inaugurated in the modernist novel the rejection of consolation manages to promote a politically progressive politics of mourning the modernist novel established as well the terms of a new mourning practice terms whose democratizing aims would be challenged in the late modernist period but ultimately reanimated and reworked by postmodern writers in challenging the familiar view of modernist aesthetics as removed from social concerns and of postmodernist aesthetics as a self reflexive language game incapable of representing affirmative content mourning modernism postmodernism demonstrates how novelists of some of the most experimental fiction of the century engage the open ended aspects of loss to imagine new forms of identity and social change

this book treats postmodernism in its own terms regarding it as a phenomenon which both represents a contemporary moment and also looks toward its own transcendence passing away disappearance the book s critical range extends from the gothic through to the most recent harbingers of modernity and describes a trajectory that will take account of recent fiction poetry and point readers to the development that will textualize into the 21st century

piranesi builds a shopping mall giotto supervises a training analysis milton directs a film in postmodernism across the ages the traditional notion of change in history the linear analogy of human development comes in for its own share of interpretation of reading and hence doubles back on itself this provocative collection of essays examines the way in which the concept of postmodernism has forced a rethinking of the intersection of time and text appropriately these essays themselves reach across the ages considering authors ranging from alexander the great to chaucer and milton to ford madox ford and umberto eco the volume concludes with a series of four dissenting afterwords that assess the import of these postmodern readings on some of the major interpretive projects of our day feminism marxism humanism and deconstruction and gay

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setting out to exemplify a new approach to social theory one forged in the course of a critical dialogue between postmodernism and marxism this book departs from classical marxist thought by directly engaging with issues in social and political theory the book offers a way forward for a new and revitalised marxist tradition the book does not fit within any single disciplinary boundary but challenges the limits imposed by conventional boundaries the author breaks with the usual postmodernism versus marxism syndrome and defies that brand of postmodernism that pronounces the death of social theory through a deconstructive rethinking of the central concepts of production law and class he attempts to demonstrate ways in which a transformed marxism can take on board and benefit from postmodernism and deconstruction without lapsing into post marxism

this dissertation analyzes the ways in which american lyric poetry has articulated and authorized a new critical discourse about war speaking for and to dissenters against u s involvement in the second world war the vietnam war and the persian gulf war this study begins with the second world war when 50 000 american conscientious objectors engaged in nonviolent social action during internment the c o poets robert lowell william stafford and william everson articulate the dilemmas of direct action in a poetry marked by self accusation and disavowal the vietnam war provoked a war resistance poetry that explicitly critiqued american nationalism and increasingly addressed the anti war movement visible in the shift in poetic address in denise levertov s lyric poetry at the same time levertov s war poetry renders visible the perils of representing the other john balaban s poetry and translations from vietnamese by contrast offer an alternative war resistance narrative communicating the complexities of witness finally the debate about the ethics of postmodernity between jean baudrillard and christopher norris in the wake of the persian gulf war enables an analysis of the lyric in activist contexts and anthologies june jordan and barrett watten in particular address the new conditions of postmodern warfare bypassing the limits of the lyric through performative and experimental poetics author s abstract
