the salton sea the largest lake in california receives the vast majority of its inflows from agricultural and municipal wastewaters released from increasing activities in its watershed this saline and eutrophic lake is nonetheless extremely valuable as wildlife habitat and for recreational activities therefore the impacts of contaminants on this ecosystem and human health have been of concern for decades to address this concern we 1 evaluated human and wildlife toxicological risks based on contaminant concentrations measured in tilapia oreochromis mossambicus and proposed safe consumption limits for anglers 2 extended this evaluation to two other abundant fish species present in the lake namely bairdiella bairdiella icistia and orangemouth corvina cynoscion xanthulus 3 assessed the long term temporal changes in selenium and arsenic concentration in fish fillet from the salton sea and proposed a plausible biogeochemical cycle for both elements in order to explain these changes both se and inorganic as concentrations were found to be elevated enough to be of potential concern for the health of anglers with regards to the potential impact on fish and piscivorous birds we could not conclude whether concentrations of as pose a threat to the fish and piscivorous birds se concentrations could be elevated enough to negatively affect fish health reproduction and immune systems of piscivorous birds but definitive studies are lacking a general linear model glm was constructed to test whether as and se levels changed over the last twenty years in fish from the lake the model revealed that se concentrations decline significantly at an overall annual rate of 3.9 percent while as concentrations increased significantly at an estimated annual rate of 11.7 percent finally we presented a set of mechanisms to explain the changes in as and se concentrations within the lake we conjectured that rising salinity and anthropogenic eutrophication of the lake have resulted in an increase in frequency of anoxic events in this polymictic lake consequently favoring the development of conditions conducive to the precipitation of se into and concomitant release of as from the

sediments thus influencing the bioavailability and bioaccumulation of the trace elements
