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should people with deeply held objections to certain practices be allowed to opt out of

involvement with them should a christian baker who objects to homosexuality be allowed to deny service to a customer seeking a cake for a gay wedding should a catholic nurse be able to refuse to contribute to the provision of abortions without losing her job the law increasingly answers no to such questions but david oderberg argues that this is a mistake he contends that in such cases opting out should be understood as part of a right of dissociation and that this right needs better legal protection than it now enjoys

how does the gospel relate to a pluralist society what is the christian message in a society marked by religious pluralism ethnic diversity and cultural relativism should christians encountering today s pluralist society concentrate on evangelism or on dialogue how does the prevailing climate of opinion affect perhaps infect christians faith these kinds of questions are addressed in this noteworthy book by lesslie newbigin a highly respected christian leader and ecumenical figure newbigin provides a brilliant analysis of contemporary secular humanist pluralist culture and suggests how christians can more confidently affirm their faith in such a context while drawing from scholars such as michael polanyi alasdair macintyre hendrikus berkhof walter wink and robert wuthnow the gospel in a pluralist society is suited not only to an academic readership this heartfelt work by a missionary pastor and preacher also offers to christian leaders and laypeople some thoughtful helpful and provocative reflections

where have political theories gone wrong this is the question nigel walshe grapples with in this book in an age of creeping authoritarianism both from the left and from the right the issues faced in the concept of a plural society are more relevant than ever what is the proper relationship between the state and free associations such as political parties trade unions and voluntary organisations how can socialism and democracy be reconciled how does the power to deselect mps and the methods used by political parties to choose their leaders affect democracy with varied and critical allusions to the works of herbert marcuse v a tumanov enoch powell and the austrian psychologist otto rank the author pleads for a recognition of the essential independence from the state of free associations and sets out the criteria for a free society the ideas in this book are intended as a contribution to a new philosophy of the left the concept of a plural society is not just about politics and law it extends to psychoanalysis and economics and is essential reading for anyone who is concerned with the state of government today book jacket

how do we deal with difference personally interpersonally nationally can we weave a cohesive

social fabric in a religiously plural society without suppressing differences this collection of significant essays suggests that to truly honour differences in matters of faith and religion we must publicly exercise and celebrate them the secular sacred public private divisions long considered sacred in the west need to be dismantled if canada or any nation state is to develop a genuine mosaic that embraces fundamental differences instead of a melting pot that marginalizes an ethics of difference starts with a recognition of difference not as deviance or deficit that threatens but as otherness to connect with cherish and celebrate the book begins with the suggestion that our inability to come to terms with social plurality is not fundamentally the fault of religious differences and that a public private split inadequately deals with matters of basic difference it then explores how encouraging people to live out their respective faiths may open new possibilities for respectful honourable and just negotiations of contemporary dilemmas arising out of the multicultural fabric of canadian life towards an ethics of community introduces readers to some of the most challenging and divisive dilemmas we face in this increasingly pluralistic postmodern world issues such as family and domestic violence aboriginal rights homosexuality and public policy and female genital mutilation this is a book truly global in scope and significance
