this book provides an overview of systematic instructional strategies and is written in a format so that teachers and other service providers can immediately put the information to use it specifically focuses upon systematic instruction for individuals with disabilities school age and adults and is generic across age groups as well as disability labels the book focuses on improving instructional practices for students and adults with disabilities practitioners may understand the importance of placing individuals in different settings e g inclusive classrooms supported employment sites but not understand how to improve their skills once they are in that setting this book is intended to give teachers and other service providers the instructional skills for improving the skills of the individuals that they are serving the most unique feature of the text is that it is written specifically for practitioners in the field teachers and adult service providers as well as those in training rather than being written for other academics an advantage of this book is that those preparing teachers and others can easily use it in methods courses as it covers instructional methodology that is seldom covered in detail in most texts college instructors will find the book a good choice for their classes based upon the consistent format throughout the book the readability of the book for students the comprehensive coverage of systematic instruction and the direct applicability to applied settings others providing instruction supervision and training to direct service providers will find this book useful such as those working in schools as well as those in transition and adult service settings

this book was first projected in 2004 when author hannah fairbairn was teaching interpersonal skills at the carroll center for the blind in newton massachusetts the experiences of her adult students and her own experience of sight lost convinced her that everyone losing vision needs access to good information about the process of adjustment to losing sight and practical ways to use assertive speech when you can t believe your eyes is intended for anyone going through vision loss their friends and families it will inform readers how to get expert professional help face the trauma of loss and navigate the world using speech more than sight each of the twelve chapters in the book contain many short sections and bullet point lists intended to facilitate access to the right information it begins where you begin at the doctor s office or the hospital since vision loss takes many forms there are suggestions for questions you might ask to get a clear diagnosis and the best treatment part one also has a description of legal blindness and possible prevention advice about your job and tips for life at home part two is about believing in yourself as you deal with the loss the anger and the fear before you come up for air and consider training parts three and four describe using assertive speech and action in all kinds of settings as your independence and confidence increase part five gives detailed information about everything from dating and caring for babies to senior living volunteering and retaining your job it is hoped that by reading and trying out the suggestions the reader will recover full confidence become a positive assertive communicator and lead a satisfying life because vision loss happens mostly in older years the book is written with seniors particularly in mind professionals will also find it to be a useful resource for their patients

on january 6 2017 a lone gunman took five lives and wounded eight people at fort lauderdale airport this book is about the lauderdale shooting told from the perspective of bestselling author william hazelgrove who just happened to be there with his wife and children though focused on one terrifying incident that the author witnessed this story is also a prototype of american shootings showing the interplay of victims police media the shooter and what constitutes this peculiar american form of violence the author documents the perverse chain of events that set the stage for this tragedy the failure of police and the fbi to stop this troubled iraq war veteran who had earlier approached them and said point blank that he was hearing voices telling him to kill others the incredible fact that his weapon was taken and then given back to him the very gun that would kill five people and shut down a major airport for forty eight hours and the circumstances of american society that allowed this gun to be checked through airport security as a legal firearm and then delivered to the killer who casually strolled into a bathroom loaded the pistol and returned to the baggage claim area to start his murderous rampage interweaving his dramatic telling of his own experiences with a history of comparable shootings in america the book presents both an anatomy of these horrifying events and the basis for understanding why they happen and what can be done to stop them
