the art through the century series introduces readers to important visual vocabulary of western art back cover

in the sixteenth century the humanist values and admiration for classical antiquity that marked the early renaissance spread from italy throughout the rest of the continent part of the art through the centuries series this volume is divided into three sections that discuss the important people concepts

and artistic centres of this period

this study addresses 19th century european art along with the forces that informed it after introducing historical events and cultural and artistic trends from about 1760 that would exert their influence well into the new century petra ten doesschate chu discusses the advent of modernism and its many interpretations she considers the changing relationship between artist and audience evolving attitudes towards the depiction of nature and the confrontation of european artists with non western art due to expanding trade and travel understanding of the art as do sidebars that focus on specific works techniques or historical circumstances although painting and sculpture are central in her narrative chu also covers a broad scope of visual culture including architecture decorative arts photography and graphic design a timeline glossary and bibliography listing not only books but also films related to the period complete the volume

fourteenth century europe was ravaged by famine war and most devastatingly the black plague these widespread crises inspired a mystical religiosity which emphasized both ecstatic joy and extreme suffering producing emotionally charged and often graphic depictions of the crucifixion and the martyrdoms of the saints this third volume in the art through the centuries series highlights the most noteworthy concepts geographic centers and artists of this turbulent century important facts about the subjects under discussion are summarized in the margins of each entry and salient features of the illustrated art works are identified and discussed

compelling and troubling colorful and dark black figures served as the quintessential image of difference in nineteenth century european art the essays in this volume further the investigation of constructions of blackness during this period this collection marks a phase in the scholarship on images of blacks that moves beyond undifferentiated binaries like negative and positive that fail to reveal complexities contradictions and ambiguities essays that cover the late eighteenth through the early twentieth century explore the visuality of blackness in anti slavery imagery black women in orientalist art race and beauty in fin de si e photography the french brand of blackface minstrelsy and a set of little known images of an african model by edvard munch in spite of the difficulty of resurrecting black lives in nineteenth century europe one essay chronicles the rare instance of an american artist of color in mid nineteenth century europe with analyses of works ranging from gault s raft of the medusa to portraits of the american actor ira aldrige this volume provides new interpretations of nineteenth century representations of blacks

before the tragedy of the holocaust many of the leading art and antiques dealers across europe were jewish establishing dynamic cross channel international and transatlantic networks aside from a few famous examples however we are only at the beginning of exploring the diversity of jewish dealers commercial and cultural worlds and reflecting on the particular conditions that made possible their

dramatic expansion within the profession adopting a wider geography than any previous study this book brings together a team of distinguished international contributors to consider jewish art dealers as an interconnected cohort tied together by common strategies and a shared vulnerability after an extended historiographical introduction the volume presents case studies and trends from 1860 1940 including jewish family businesses in western europe the role of jews as mediators of art from east asia the antisemitism and suspicion faced by jewish dealers jews as theorists exhibition makers and promoters of modern art and the geographical mobility and professional reinvention of jewish dealers in times of economic and political crisis with a wide variety of illustrations including paintings decorative arts historic photographs and archival material the volume adopts a mix of methodological approaches to analyse a key chapter in jewish cultural history and in the history of the international art market includes afterword by charles dellheim author of belonging and betrayal how jews made the art world modern 2021

the emancipation of jews in europe during the nineteenth century meant that for the first time they could participate in areas of secular life including established art academies that had previously been closed to them by legal restrictions jewish artists took many complex routes to establish their careers some such as camille pissaro managed to distinguish themselves without making any reference to their jewish heritage in their art others such as simeon solomon and maurycy gottlieb wrestled with their identities as well to produce images of jewish experience the pogroms that began in the late nineteenth century brought home to jews the problematic relationship of minority groups to majority cultures and artists such as maurycy minkowski and samuel hirszenberg confronted the horror of the deaths of thousands of jews in powerful images of destruction and despair comprehensively illustrated in color throughout painting in nineteenth century europe explores for the first time every aspect of the role of jewish artists within nineteenth century european art

this book brings together thirteen scholars to introduce the newest and most cutting edge research in the field of russian and east european art history reconsidering canonical figures re examining prevalent debates and revisiting aesthetic developments the book challenges accepted histories and entrenched dichotomies in art and architecture from the nineteenth century to the present in doing so it resituates the artistic production of this region within broader socio cultural currents and analyzes its interconnections with international discourse competing political and aesthetic ideologies and continuous discussions over identity

this beautifully illustrated guide analyzes the most important people places and concepts of this early renaissance period whose explosion of creativity was to spread throughout europe in the sixteenth century influenced by a revival of interest in greco roman ideals and sponsored by a newly prosperous merchant class fifteenth century artists produced works of astonishingly innovative content and technique the international gothic style of painting still popular at the beginning of the

century was giving way to the influence of early netherlandish flemish masters such as jan van eyck who emphasized narrative and the complex use of light for symbolic meaning patrons favored paintings in oil and on wooden panels for works ranging from large hinged altarpieces to small increasingly lifelike portraits in the italian city states of florence venice and mantua artists and architects alike perfected existing techniques and developed new ones the painter masaccio mastered linear perspective the sculptor donatello produced anatomically correct but idealized figures such as his bronze nude of david and the brilliant architect and engineer brunelleschi integrated gothic and renaissance elements to build the self supporting dome of the florence cathedral

constructing african art histories for the lagoons of c d ivoire is an investigation of the methods employed by art historians who study creative production in africa while providing insights into the rich visual arts of the lagoon peoples of southeastern c d ivoire this study is one of the few attempts by an africanist to situate local and regional artistic practices in the context of the global art market and to trace the varied receptions an african art work is given as it leaves a local context and enters an international one drawing on her three seasons of fieldwork among akan populations in c d ivoire monica blackmun vison rovides a comprehensive account of a major art producing region of africa and explores such topics as gender roles in performance the role of sculpture in divination and the interchange of arts and ideas across ethnic boundaries the book also addresses issues inherent in research practices such as connoisseurship and participant observation and examines theoretical positions that have had an impact on the discipline of african art history

japan and japonisme the self and the other in representations of japanese culture explores japan s engagement with and responses to japonisme and presents new perspectives on the history and enduring influence of japonisme as a cultural discourse the term japonisme has come to encapsulate the west s interests in japanese arts and culture in the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries japonisme contributed to japan s global reputation as an artistic nation but it also produced persistent stereotypes about the japanese such as the image of geisha this pioneering anthology also demonstrates how japan has espoused the modern western fascination with its arts and culture to create and promote its national cultural identity japan and japonisme introduces innovative studies on japonisme by leading experts in the field and covers the visual arts art criticism and exhibitions fashion literature horticulture and popular culture in france italy the united kingdom and the united states

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
