opposed to the traditional male and female roles instead of using man woman labels in the instructions author brandon whited uses terminology such as partner a partner b leader follower and supported partner supportive partner this approach gives a broad appeal to dance partnering book contents dance partnering basics is organized around the foundational elements of dance time weight energy and flow and space chapter 1 provides a concise history and explanation of dance partnering forms and considers the broad implications for the practice as a vital component of dance education and training chapter 2 focuses on class planning course development foundational concepts and teaching techniques it also offers foundational skills and exercises chapter 3 delves into the body as an instrument discussing biomechanics safety cross training nutrition wellness and self care it also offers more advanced skills building off of those offered in the previous chapter in chapter 4 readers explore the relationship between partnership and creativity digging into tactics exercises and choreographic prompts that can help unlock creativity it contains the exercises with the most advanced skills and partnership principles and finally chapter 5 outlines dance education philosophies which include establishing a safe space a supportive environment and a community within the classroom and beyond dance partnering basics is a highly practical resource for dance educators and teachers across all levels from k 12 to higher education as well as private studios it is an ideal text to teach partnering regardless of the students ages their skill level or the dance genre with its unique inclusive approach this book is a welcome and much needed addition to the dance field note a code for accessing hkpropel is not included with this ebook but may be purchased separately

embracing dramatic similarities glaring disjunctions and striking innovations this book explores the history and context of dance on the land we know today as the united states of america designed for weekly use in dance history courses it traces dance in the usa as it broke traditional forms crossed genres provoked social and political change and drove cultural exchange and collision the authors put a particular focus on those whose voices have been silenced unacknowledged and or uncredited exploring racial prejudice and injustice intersectional feminism protest movements and economic conditions as well as demonstrating how socio political issues and movements affect and are affected by dance in looking at concert dance vernacular dance ritual dance and the convergence of these forms the chapters acknowledge the richness of dance in today s usa and the strong foundations on which it stands milestones are a range of accessible textbooks breaking down the need to know moments in the social cultural political and artistic development of foundational subject areas this book is ideal for undergraduate courses that embrace culturally responsive pedagogy and seek to shift the direction of the lens from western theatrical dance towards the wealth of dance forms in the united states

american society for aesthetics selma jeanne cohen prize in dance aesthetics examining a century of dance criticism in the united states and its influence on aesthetics and inclusion dance criticism has long been integral to dance as an art form serving as documentation and validation of dance performances yet few studies have taken a close look at the impact of key critics and approaches to criticism over time the first book to examine dance criticism in the united states across 100 years from the late 1920s to the early twenty first century shaping dance canons

argues that critics in the popular press have influenced how dance has been defined and valued as well as which artists and dance forms have been taken most seriously kate mattingly likens the effect of dance writing to that of a flashlight illuminating certain aesthetics at the expense of others mattingly shows how criticism can preserve and reproduce criteria for what qualifies as high art through generations of writers and in dance history courses textbooks and curricular design she examines the gatekeeping role of prominent critics such as john martin and yvonne rainer while highlighting the often overlooked perspectives of writers from minoritized backgrounds and dance traditions the book also includes an analysis of digital platforms and current dance projects on the boards tv thinkingdance black dance stories and amara tabor smith's house full of blackwomen that challenge systemic exclusions in doing so the book calls for ongoing dialogue and action to make dance criticism more equitable and inclusive

drawing of the postmodern perspective and concerns that informed her groundbreaking *terpsichore in sneakers* sally banes's writing *dancing* documents the background and developments of avant garde and popular dance analyzing individual artists performances and entire dance movements with a sure grasp of shifting cultural dynamics banes shows how postmodern dance is integrally connected to other oppositional often marginalized strands of dance culture and considers how certain kinds of dance move from the margins to the mainstream banes begins by considering the act of dance criticism itself exploring its modes methods and underlying assumptions and examining the work of other critics she traces the development of contemporary dance from the early work of such influential figures as merce cunningham and george balanchine to such contemporary choreographers as molissa fenley karole armitage and michael clark she analyzes the contributions of the judson dance theatre and the workers dance league the emergence of latin postmodern dance in new york and the impact of black jazz in russia in addition banes explores such untraditional performance modes as breakdancing and the drunk dancing of fred astaire ebook edition note ebook edition note all images have been redacted
